- 19 improved benefits, and his dedication and diligence benefited
- 20 countless public servants; and
- 21 WHEREAS, A man of many interests, Mr. Zivley loved politics,
- 22 ardently supported the NRA, and enjoyed hunting and cheering on his
- 23 favorite sports teams, including the Longhorns, the Yankees, and
