## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS constitutes a global health crisis: more
- 2 than 30 million people around the world are currently infected, and
- 3 no cure for the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), which causes
- 4 AIDS, has yet been developed; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In Texas, over 60,000 individuals are presently
- 6 living with HIV/AIDS, and more than 5,000 cases of HIV are diagnosed
- 7 each year; AIDS-related deaths in the state number approximately
- 8 1,000 annually; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Early testing is critical to preventing further
- 10 spread of the disease and also to getting medication that can slow
- 11 its progress, and many people are tested too late; one in three
- 12 Texans who are newly diagnosed with HIV has already developed AIDS;
- 13 late testing is especially common among older Texans; senior
- 14 citizens with HIV/AIDS face a double stigma: ageism and infection
- 15 with a sexually or IV-drug transmitted disease; and
- 16 WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS continues to pose a critical threat to
- 17 public health in the Lone Star State, and it is essential that
- 18 Texans be able to meet this challenge through adequate awareness
- 19 and understanding; now, therefore, be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
- 21 Legislature hereby recognize February 11, 2009, as HIV/AIDS
- 22 Awareness Day in the State of Texas and that citizens throughout the
- 23 state be encouraged to educate themselves about the nature,
- 24 prevention, and treatment of HIV/AIDS.
