

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Civic-minded women from across the Lone Star State  
2 are gathering in Austin on April 16, 2009, to celebrate Texas  
3 Federation of Republican Women Day at the Capitol; and

4           WHEREAS, The Texas Federation of Republican Women was  
5 established in San Antonio in October 1955; with more than 300  
6 delegates present, the organizing convention was led by Mrs.  
7 Malcolm Milburn, and it resulted in the election of Mrs. R. D.  
8 O'Callaghan as the first president; in the 53 years since its  
9 inception, the organization's membership has grown to include more  
10 than 10,000 participants in 167 chapters throughout Texas; and

11           WHEREAS, With the goals of educating women on the political  
12 process, electing Republican candidates, and encouraging women to  
13 run for office, TFRW produces quarterly publications and hosts  
14 regular meetings that cover such issues as health, crime, and the  
15 economy; the organization also works closely with the Republican  
16 Party to train volunteers and provide support for local and  
17 statewide campaigns; and

18           WHEREAS, This notable organization embodies a spirit of  
19 public engagement, and its members may indeed reflect with great  
20 pride on the exemplary model of citizenship they have set for their  
21 fellow Texans; now, therefore, be it
