1           WHEREAS, Members of the Texas Parent Teacher Association are  
2 gathering at the State Capitol on February 26, 2009; and

3           WHEREAS, This year marks 100 years of service by the group,  
4 whose members share a common goal to provide the best possible  
5 education for Texas youths; to that end, the organization  
6 diligently works to promote a positive environment in the home,  
7 school, and community, secure adequate laws for the care and  
8 protection of children, and forge a closer relationship between the  
9 home and school; and

10           WHEREAS, The group's more than 630,000 members consist of  
11 parents, educators, and other concerned citizens from around the  
12 state who together make up the largest child-advocacy organization  
13 in Texas; and

14           WHEREAS, Founded in 1909, the Texas PTA is organized into 18  
15 geographic areas, 93 councils, and more than 2,600 local campus  
16 groups; local PTAs meet, study problems, support teachers, and  
17 attend parenting workshops, and by becoming more informed on issues  
18 regarding children and education, members become more effective  
19 teachers and parents and more engaged citizens; and
