- WHEREAS, Irene Cardenas was born on April 9, 1909, to Petra
- 5 and Serapio Cardenas of Del Rio; she graduated from Del Rio High
- 6 School in 1927 and earned a teacher's certificate and master's
- 7 degree in education from Sul Ross State Teachers College in Alpine;

- 9 WHEREAS, In 1932, this esteemed Texan married the love of her
- 10 life, Ernest Cardwell, and the couple shared 59 rewarding years of
- 11 matrimony; they became the parents of four children, Teresita,
- 12 Louis, Thomas, and David, and later had the pleasure of welcoming 10
- 13 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren into their family; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Ms. Cardwell made innumerable contributions to the
- 15 lives of young Texans during her more than four decades in the field
- 16 of education; she taught first grade for over 31 years in the San
- 17 Felipe Independent School District, worked as an elementary school
- 18 principal for 14 years, and served at length in Washington, D.C., as
- 19 a presidential appointee to the National Advisory Council on the
- 20 Education of Disadvantaged Children; in 1999, on the date of her
- 21 90th birthday, her myriad accomplishments were recognized when
- 22 Travis Elementary, where she had previously worked, was renamed
- 23 Irene C. Cardwell Elementary School in her honor; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Dedicated to bettering her community, Ms. Cardwell

1 contributed to numerous committees and organizations and often took on leadership roles in these efforts; a brief list of the groups she 2 aided includes the March of Dimes, the United Fund Drive, the Diamond Jubilee Celebration Committee, the Val Verde Memorial 4 Hospital Women's Auxiliary, and the Val Verde County Library Board, 5 and there were many others; she also instituted such initiatives as 6 free citizenship classes with LULAC Council 353 and social 7 enhancement through the Boots and Bows Square Dance Club, and her 8 role in the formation of the first Girl Scout troop in her district 9 earned her the title of "Woman of Distinction" from the Girl Scouts 10

12 WHEREAS, Many other accolades were conferred upon Cardwell throughout her remarkable life; she was honored by the 13 14 Texas House of Representatives, by two Texas governors, 15 President Richard Nixon for her service to disadvantaged children, and by President Harry Truman for her contributions to the 16 17 Selective Service System; her contributions in education were further acknowledged by the American Association of University 18 19 Women and the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers, and her diligent work in service to her church earned her the Archbishop 20 Francis Furey Bronze Medal as well as other honors; moreover, she 21 was named Lions Club Citizen of the Year, given the community 22 23 service award by the Knights of Columbus, and recognized by the U.S. 24 Department of Justice Immigration and Naturalization Service as well as Casa de la Cultura in Del Rio; and 25
