- 2 Wilhelmina Daisy Cullen Robertson Smith of Houston, who died on
- 3 January 26, 2009, at the age of 86; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The former Wilhelmina Cullen was the daughter of
- 5 Hugh Roy Cullen and Lillie Cranz Cullen; she attended Sweet Briar
- 6 College in Virginia during World War II, but she returned to Texas
- 7 and earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Houston in
- 8 1944; the following year, she married Corbin James Robertson, Sr.,
- 9 who was serving in the Army Air Corps at Ellington Field; the couple
- 10 nurtured a fulfilling relationship until Mr. Robertson's passing in
- 11 1991; fortunate to find love a second time, she was joined in
- 12 matrimony to Edgar A. Smith, Jr., in 1998; and
- WHEREAS, An active philanthropist, Mrs. Smith helped launch
- 14 the magnet program in Houston's public schools, and she led her
- 15 family's organization, the Cullen Foundation, for five decades,
- 16 through which she assisted numerous local institutions, including
- 17 Baylor College of Medicine and the Texas Medical Center; she also
- 18 established three trusts to benefit higher education, health, and
- 19 the performing arts; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Smith was especially devoted to the University
- 21 of Houston, and she was one of her alma mater's most dedicated
- 22 supporters; her parents also have a place in UH history, as they are
- 23 regarded as its founding family and the school's first major
- 24 benefactors; through the years, Mrs. Smith continued her parents'

- 1 legacy, and she shared this commitment with her first husband, who
- 2 supported the university's early athletic programs and for whom
- 3 Corbin J. Robertson Stadium is named; a life member of the UH Alumni
- 4 Organization, Mrs. Smith was awarded an honorary doctoral degree in
- 5 1988 and a Distinguished Alumni award in 1989; moreover, the UH
- 6 Board of Regents approved the construction of the Wilhelmina
- 7 Robertson Smith Pavilion, a sports complex to be built at Robertson
- 8 Stadium; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Dedicated to her community, Wilhelmina Smith was an
- 10 inspiration to all who were fortunate enough to know her, and she
- 11 leaves behind an extraordinary legacy of generosity and goodwill
- 12 that will not soon be forgotten; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
- 14 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Wilhelmina Daisy
- 15 Cullen Robertson Smith and extend sincere sympathy to the members
