RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of Williamson County lost a respected 2 court judge and a beloved member of the community with the passing 3 of the Honorable William Sunday Lott on February 11, 2009, at the 4 age of 90; and

5 WHEREAS, Born on April 28, 1918, to Hervey and Fannie Lott, 6 William Lott grew up in Amarillo and earned his law degree from The 7 University of Texas School of Law in 1940; answering his nation's 8 call to duty during World War II, he served with the U.S. Army 9 Security Intelligence Corps and was selected to travel to San 10 Francisco for the conference where the United Nations was 11 organized; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lott married the former Ellagene Eanes in 1944, and the couple were blessed with two children, Cathy and Bill, and two grandchildren, Ryan and Neal; Mr. Lott served as assistant attorney general for the State of Texas from 1947 to 1952 and afterward opened a private law practice in Georgetown; and

WHEREAS, In 1976, he was elected judge of the 26th District 17 Court of Williamson County; during his 16 years of dedicated 18 service on the bench, he played a pivotal role in establishing the 19 county's "tough on crime" reputation; an expert on evidence and 20 procedure, he was passionate about the law and maintained a strict, 21 no-nonsense atmosphere in his courtroom; he was instrumental in the 22 23 creation of the Central Texas Treatment Center for drug and alcohol rehabilitation and instituted salient reforms to the county's 24

1 juvenile probation system; the county paid tribute to his life and work in 1986 by naming the William S. Lott Juvenile Center in his 2 3 honor; following his retirement from the court in 1992, Judge Lott continued to share his knowledge and expertise with members of the 4 5 court, keeping himself available to fill in as a visiting judge; and WHEREAS, Judge Lott received numerous accolades in his 6 7 distinguished career, including the Man of the Year honor from the 8 Georgetown Chamber of Commerce in 1979 and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Georgetown Area Community Foundation, and he was 9 10 elected president of the Williamson County Bar Association; and

11 WHEREAS, Active in his community, Judge Lott was a director 12 of First National Bank in Georgetown, a Mason for more than 60 years, and a member of the Georgetown Rotary and Lions Clubs; 13 14 moreover, he was a congregant at First United Methodist Church of 15 Georgetown, where he served as a trustee; he also served on the regional boards of the Wesleyan Home, the United Way, the American 16 17 Cancer Society, the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts of America, and the Georgetown Citizens' Advisory Committee; and 18

WHEREAS, A quintessential Southern gentleman with a wicked sense of humor, William Lott served the residents of Williamson County with integrity, compassion, and an unwavering devotion to the well-being of his community and its citizens, and all those fortunate enough to have known him will forever cherish their memories of this esteemed Texan; now, therefore, be it
