R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A delegation from Ed White Memorial High School in
2 League City is visiting the State Capitol on March 12, 2009, and
3 this occasion provides a fitting opportunity to honor the school
4 and its parent organization, Bay Area Charter School, Inc.; and

5 WHEREAS, Bay Area Charter School is a nonprofit,
6 open-enrollment charter school community that serves 19
7 independent school districts in the Galveston Bay area; its mission
8 is to foster the excitement of learning through an interactive
9 educational environment that values the gifts and talents of every
10 child and to encourage cooperation among students, parents, and the
11 community, and its schools are guided by the principle that
12 students learn best in project-based environments that focus on
13 real world applications; and

15 Memorial High School opened its doors in 1998; its classes are
16 limited in size to 20 students, and the school is designed to
17 address the individual needs of the students through a personalized
18 curriculum; Ed White Memorial also features advanced placement and
19 career and technology courses, online learning opportunities, and
20 dual-enrollment courses offered in conjunction with College of the
21 Mainland; and

23 education, Bay Area Charter School is helping its students succeed
24 academically and realize their full potential, and in so doing, it

1 is building a solid foundation for the future achievement of many
2 young Texans; now, therefore, be it
