

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, After nearly two decades of distinguished service,  
2 Jim Wyatt is retiring from the Victoria City Council in May 2009;  
3 and

4           WHEREAS, Victoria's first African American council member  
5 and mayor pro tempore, Jim Wyatt won the District 5 seat in 1988 and  
6 held it until 1995; since his return to the city council in 2000, he  
7 has served continuously through his current term, and he has chosen  
8 not to seek reelection; having been employed as a materials manager  
9 for DuPont, Mr. Wyatt brought a unique perspective and a range of  
10 business expertise to municipal government, and he played an  
11 instrumental role in such projects as the sports complex, the skate  
12 park, and Lone Tree Road; he was also particularly interested in  
13 providing programs and activities for at-risk youth, and he  
14 encouraged them to seek peaceful means of resolving conflicts; and

15           WHEREAS, In addition to his participation on the city  
16 council, Mr. Wyatt has served on the board of directors of the Texas  
17 Municipal League and as president of the Texas Association of  
18 Mayors and Council Members; he has also been active in numerous  
19 community organizations, including the African American Chamber of  
20 Commerce of Victoria, the Task Force Toward Community Peace, and  
21 the Victoria World Hunger Project; and

22           WHEREAS, A dedicated public servant, Jim Wyatt is an  
23 inspiration to his fellow citizens, and he may indeed reflect with  
24 great pride on his many notable achievements; now, therefore, be it
