    WHEREAS, Our nation faces great energy and environmental challenges because of our reliance on foreign sources of energy and because of emissions caused by both mobile and static sources; and

    WHEREAS, The state's abundant wind resources diversify our energy mix, provide cost-competitive power, and protect our environment; moreover, they contribute to economic growth through the creation of jobs; and

    WHEREAS, Texas has taken a key role in building transmission capacity to bring power from wind-rich areas to populated urban areas through the creation of Competitive Renewable Energy Zones; and

    WHEREAS, The nation's leader in wind energy production, Texas currently generates more than 8,000 megawatts of electricity from wind with another 1,630 megawatts under construction; together, this is enough energy to power 2.4 million homes; and
