- 18 lifelong dream and became a rancher, raising livestock on his
- 19 property near Brenham; he was also a member of the Northside Riding
- 20 Club and Greater True Light Missionary Baptist Church; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Harold Moore had a generosity of spirit that
- 22 expressed itself in myriad ways; he delighted in the company of
- 23 young people and enjoyed mentoring them and encouraging them to
