## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The untimely passing of Patricia Ann Matheny of 2 Austin on June 25, 2007, at the age of 56, brought a profoundly felt 3 loss to her family, to her friends and colleagues, and to the 4 residents of her community; and

WHEREAS, Born on December 19, 1950, the former Patricia Ann 5 Pianta grew up in Essex, Connecticut, and she went on to graduate 6 7 from Mercy High School in nearby Middletown; she earned a bachelor's degree in education from Rivier College in Nashua, New 8 9 Hampshire, in 1972; she later met John Matheny in Stamford, 10 Connecticut, and the couple were joined in matrimony in 1977; Mrs. Matheny taught at local schools and worked toward a master's degree 11 12 in counseling, which she attained from Fairfield University in 1980, and she also completed an internship at Yale University; in 13 14 1981, Mr. and Mrs. Matheny welcomed their first child, Colin, and two years later, they were blessed with a daughter, Molly; and 15

16 WHEREAS, Due to her husband's profession, Mrs. Matheny and her family relocated a number of times, and by 1984, they were 17 living in Dallas, where Mrs. Matheny taught elementary school; 18 having moved to Houston in 1988, she began working with teenagers 19 20 and substance abuse patients at a psychiatric facility, Stafford Meadows Hospital; however, her passion for teaching children led 21 her to seek a position as an elementary school counselor with the 22 23 Katy Independent School District in 1991; eight years later, she and her family relocated to Austin, and she obtained a similar 24

position within Round Rock ISD; employed at Fern Bluff Elementary School for seven years, Mrs. Matheny garnered praise from her students and their parents, as well as her fellow staff members, for her compassion and professionalism and for being an anchor for the school community during trying times; in February 2007, she transferred to Lakeway Elementary School in Austin, and by that time, she had dedicated 35 years to the field of education; and

8 WHEREAS, This devoted wife and mother took great pleasure in 9 spending time with her family and friends in the home she had 10 carefully decorated; she was a gourmet cook and an elegant 11 entertainer, and she loved collecting antiques; moreover, Mrs. 12 Matheny was a talented musician, and she sang with the Houston 13 Masterworks Chorus for several years as a first soprano; and

14 WHEREAS, An admired educator and a cherished friend, Patricia 15 Matheny touched the lives of countless individuals with her 16 kindness and generosity, and she leaves behind a legacy that will 17 forever be treasured by all those who were fortunate enough to know 18 her; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas 20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Patricia Ann Matheny 21 and extend sincere sympathy to the members of her family: to her 22 husband, John Matheny; to her children, Colin and Molly Matheny; to 23 her parents, Arthur and Florence Pianta; to her siblings, Nancy 24 Liebman and Michael Pianta; and to her other relatives and many 25 friends; and, be it further
