1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Hutto are gathering in Austin on
2 April 1, 2009, to celebrate Hutto Day at the State Capitol; and

3 WHEREAS, Situated on the rich black lands of southwestern
4 Williamson County, Hutto is ideally located in close proximity to
5 Austin, Round Rock, and Georgetown; it rests adjacent to the
6 premier new highway project in the state, SH-130, and it is only
7 minutes away from the IH-35 NAFTA corridor; and

8 WHEREAS, This dynamic community perfectly balances its
9 small-town charm with expanding retail opportunities and a growing
10 park system; enjoying strong support from the town's residents,
11 Hutto's exceptional schools are growing at a rate of 20 percent each
12 year; and
