- 15 sales agent until his retirement at the age of 71; and
- WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan carried his love of basketball
- 17 with him throughout his life, finding time on nights and weekends to
- 18 play and officiate city league games in San Antonio; he was active
- 19 in the sport until his late 60s and helped found the city's first
- 20 Catholic Youth Organization basketball program; and
- 21 WHEREAS, In all of his endeavors, Mr. Bernal enjoyed the love
- 22 and support of his wife, Mary Louise, their two daughters, Linda and
- 23 Roseanna, and their son, Rudy, who is the head basketball coach at
- 24 Lanier High, his father's alma mater; and
