WHEREAS, An active member of her community, Mrs. Deats attended First United Methodist Church in Dickinson for 74 years, where she was a teacher and superintendent of the Sunday school; she was also a scout leader, a member of the PTA, and a founder of the 55-Plus organization; and

22 WHEREAS, Affectionately known to her friends as "Deatsie," 23 she was a vivacious woman who found great pleasure in trying new 24 things at an age when many people are content to take it easy; after
