WHEREAS, The son of Petra and Toribio Salinas, Armando 5 6 Salinas was born on March 23, 1913, in the Starr County town of Salineño; orphaned at the age of 13, he worked to support his four 7 8 siblings; in 1939, he entered the produce business, first as an employee of Vahlsing Produce Company, and by the late 1940s as the 9 10 owner and operator of a fleet of produce delivery trucks; he went on 11 to retire as the proprietor of a tow truck business, which included 12 a salvage yard and a used car lot in La Blanca; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salinas was known for his adventurous spirit and his willingness to try new things, and he was a lifelong Democrat who never failed to vote in an election; he relocated with his family to Elsa in 1942, and he helped his friends and neighbors in the community in every way he could, even using his own fleet of trucks to transport lumber for the construction of Sacred Heart Church; and

20 WHEREAS, The former Francisca "Panchita" Canales was born to 21 Natividad and Lucia Canales on April 2, 1914, in Salineño; married 22 to Mr. Salinas for 69 years, she was a strong matriarch and an 23 outstanding cook; she took great pride in keeping her kitchen busy 24 and in entertaining relatives, friends, and neighbors, and she was 25 cherished for her sense of humor, her wisdom, and her bright smile;
