## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The death of former Wichita Falls police chief 2 Curtis R. Harrelson on March 29, 2009, at the age of 69, has deeply 3 saddened the community he served with enormous dedication for more 4 than three decades; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Wichita Falls, Mr. Harrelson was born on 6 March 31, 1939, to Wilson and Mabel Harrelson; his family moved to 7 Archer City when he was 10, and after graduation from Archer City 8 High School, he enlisted in the United States Army; on May 1, 1959, 9 he married the former Martha Jean Worley, and while he was serving 10 as a military police officer in Huntsville, Alabama, the couple 11 became the proud parents of two sons; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Harrelson joined the Wichita Falls Police Department in 1962 and worked as a juvenile investigator and auto 13 14 theft investigator before helping to organize the narcotics section; while rising through the ranks, he graduated from the FBI 15 16 National Academy and earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Midwestern State University; he became chief of police 17 in March 1977 and his strong leadership was crucial when a tornado 18 19 struck the city some two years later; and

20 WHEREAS, During his 20-year tenure as chief, Curtis Harrelson 21 worked diligently to place his department at the forefront of crime 22 prevention; he instituted Operation ID and neighborhood watch 23 programs that influenced other departments, and collaborated with 24 numerous law enforcement agencies to establish the North Texas

1 Regional Drug Enforcement Task Force; in addition, he reinstated
2 the department's motorcycle unit and K9 teams; and

3 WHEREAS, Chief Harrelson was a mentor to countless young officers and a role model in the wider community; he founded Police 4 5 Explorer Post 500 to introduce teenagers to career opportunities in law enforcement and helped area residents form a Wichita Falls 6 Crime Stoppers organization; his writing talent enlivened the 7 8 departmental newsletter he started, and he published a moving article in Texas Police Journal headlined "Who says cops don't 9 10 cry?"; and

11 WHEREAS, From an early age, this dynamic Texan loved 12 aviation, and after his retirement in 1997, he flew pipeline for 11 13 years; a certified FAA instructor, he taught many people to become 14 pilots; he was a valued member of Faith Village Church of Christ and 15 a devoted family man who enjoyed spending time with his seven grandchildren; his many interests included hunting, four-wheeling, 16 17 and working on the computer, and he belonged to the Rockin Wheels chapter of the Good Sam Club for RV travelers; moreover, he 18 19 participated in such activities as the Hotter 'N Hell Hundred 20 bicycling event; and

21 WHEREAS, Curtis Harrelson was widely admired for his 22 integrity, professionalism, and commitment to public safety, and he 23 had a positive impact on Wichita Falls that continues to resonate; 24 he will long be remembered by the many people whose lives he 25 touched; now, therefore, be it

26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas 27 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Curtis R. Harrelson
