R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Members of the Combined Law Enforcement
2 Associations of Texas are holding their 12th biennial Texas Peace
3 Officers' Memorial Ceremony on May 4, 2009, and this solemn event
4 provides a fitting opportunity to honor those heroic public
5 servants who placed themselves in harm's way to safeguard the lives
6 and property of their fellow Texans; and

7 WHEREAS, Citizens throughout the state appreciate the brave
8 officers who, by their selfless dedication to the public welfare,
9 enable us to enjoy the benefits of a peaceful and orderly society;

11 WHEREAS, These men and women willingly risk their lives each
12 day in order to investigate crimes and to patrol our roadways,
13 communities, prisons, parks, and borderlands; moreover, they
14 respond in times of crisis, and they also work to educate the public
15 about crime prevention, adherence to the law, and safety awareness;

17 WHEREAS, Officer Gary Gryder of the Houston Police Department
18 exemplified in his professional conduct the virtues of courage,
19 dedication, and fortitude throughout his 23 years of service with
20 the department; and

21 WHEREAS, On June 29, 2008, Gary Gryder was killed in the line
22 of duty, and his untimely death represents a tragic loss to his
23 family, to his fellow officers, and to the entire community; and

24 WHEREAS, The heroism of Gary Gryder has earned this esteemed

1 Texan our deepest gratitude, which the passage of time can never
2 diminish; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
4 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Officer Gary Gryder of
5 the Houston Police Department and extend deepest sympathy to his
6 loved ones; and, be it further

7 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
8 prepared for the members of his family and that when the Texas House
9 of Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Gary
10 Gryder.
