R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the heartache felt
2 at the loss of U.S. Army Specialist Quincy J. Green of El Paso, who
3 died on June 2, 2008, at the age of 26; and

4 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 601st Aviation Support Battalion,
5 1st Combat Aviation Brigade, 1st Infantry Division, based in Fort
6 Riley, Kansas, Specialist Green lost his life while bravely serving
7 his country in Tikrit, Iraq; and

8 WHEREAS, Quincy Green graduated in 2001 from Orange Park High
9 School in Florida, where he endeared himself to others with his
10 optimism, energy, and sense of humor; he was a dedicated member of
11 the ROTC who often stayed up late prepping for Navy Junior ROTC
12 events, and he was beloved for his lively performances as the
13 school's mascot at football games; and

14 WHEREAS, Following in his brother's footsteps, this esteemed
15 young man enlisted in the army in 2003 and went on to become a
16 chaplain's assistant; he was on his first deployment to Iraq at the
17 time of his death; and

18 WHEREAS, Our state and nation are fortunate to have men and
19 women whose love for their country inspires them to take up military
20 service, yet the tragic death of this dedicated young man is a
21 sobering reminder of the cost of war; Specialist Green embodied the
22 highest ideals of the U.S. armed forces, and those who knew and
23 loved him will forever carry him close in their hearts; now,
24 therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
2 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of U.S. Army Specialist
3 Quincy J. Green and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his
4 family: to his wife, Lori; to his daughters, Alanah and Kaitlyn; and
5 to his other relatives and many friends; and, be it further

7 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
8 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Quincy
