RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, It is vital that unused prescription medicine be
- 2 properly disposed of to avoid drug diversion; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Food and Drug Administration worked with the
- 4 White House Office of National Drug Control Policy to develop the
- 5 first consumer guidelines for proper disposal of prescription
- 6 drugs; the same disposal methods for prescription drugs apply to
- 7 over-the-counter drugs as well; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Issued in 2007, the federal guidelines warn against
- 9 flushing prescription drugs down the toilet unless the drug label
- 10 or patient information specifically says to do so; and
- 11 WHEREAS, If no instructions for the medicine are given, the
- 12 guidelines call for the drugs to be taken out of their original
- 13 containers and mixed with an undesirable substance, such as coffee
- 14 grounds or kitty litter; this way the medication will be less
- 15 appealing to children and pets and unrecognizable through the trash
- 16 bag; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The guidelines go on to recommend putting the
- 18 medicine in a sealable bag, empty can, or other container to prevent
- 19 the medication from leaking or breaking out of a garbage bag; in
- 20 addition, it is suggested that all identifying information be
- 21 removed from the container to protect one's identity and personal
- 22 health information; and
- WHEREAS, Disposing of medicine in the household trash is
- 24 preferable to flushing it down the toilet because landfills are

- 1 governed by strict Environmental Protection Agency regulations to
- 2 prevent disposed items from affecting the environment; now,
- 3 therefore, be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
- 5 Legislature hereby encourage all Texans to properly dispose of
- 6 prescription and over-the-counter drugs.
