## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The city of El Paso lost a respected public servant
and business leader with the passing of Pablo Salcido on April 18,
2009, at the age of 52; and

WHEREAS, Throughout his life, Mr. Salcido was known for his 4 5 energy and enthusiasm in a wide range of endeavors; the president of the student body during his time at El Paso High School, he was also 6 7 a near-constant presence on the field at football games, serving as the quarterback of the team and then taking up his trumpet at 8 9 halftime to perform with the marching band; after receiving his diploma in 1974, he went on to earn a bachelor's degree at Austin 10 11 College and later graduated with a master's degree from the Lyndon 12 B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at The University of Texas at Austin; and 13

14 WHEREAS, Possessing a deep interest in international issues, 15 he joined the Peace Corps and worked to assist special needs 16 children and hurricane victims in Honduras; after returning to the 17 United States, he took a job in San Antonio city government under 18 Mayor Henry Cisneros and helped coordinate the city's successful 19 efforts to spur economic growth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salcido returned to El Paso in the late 1980s to become the city's first economic development director, and his pioneering efforts attracted numerous companies to the area; he later held a number of business positions in the El Paso area, working as general manager for KINT-TV and as a member of the

1 management team for EDM, which gave him experience in project and 2 plant management; and

3 WHEREAS, Building on his Peace Corps experience, this 4 motivated leader became the director of the International 5 City/County Management Association and undertook projects in 6 Central and South America to help countries develop stable, 7 democratic government institutions at the state and local level; 8 and

9 WHEREAS, In 2006, Mr. Salcido once again took up public 10 service in his hometown when he was hired as the president and chief executive officer for the City of El Paso Housing Authority; he then 11 12 became the president and CEO of Paso Del Norte Group, an assignment in which he was responsible for uniting business, political, and 13 14 community leaders in the region to accomplish community service 15 projects; his final position was as president and CEO of Tigua Incorporated, where he began work in June 2008; and 16

WHEREAS, The loss of this esteemed Texan is keenly felt by the numerous friends that he made through the years as well as by the many people whose lives were made better by his efforts; an individual of great integrity who committed himself to helping others in myriad ways, Pablo Salcido set an inspiring example of civic engagement, and his work will be remembered and admired for years to come; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Pablo Salcido and extend deepest condolences to the members of his family: to his wife, Cheryl; to his children, Jordan, Briana, and Alyssa; to his
