## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The late Derrick Lanier Geter of Dallas had a 2 lasting influence on his community through his notable endeavors in 3 behalf of its most vulnerable residents, and it is indeed fitting to 4 celebrate his life and legacy of service; and

5 WHEREAS, Born on February 13, 1963, in Augusta, Georgia, Mr. Geter was the son of Tommie Geter, Jr., and Dorothy Geter; when he 6 7 was nearly five years old, his family moved from Langley, South Carolina, to Dallas, and he graduated from David W. Carter High 8 9 School; he served his country in the Army National Guard and continued his studies at the American Trades Institute; he was 10 employed with SmithKline Beecham Laboratories for a decade, 11 12 although gospel music was always his true calling; and

13 WHEREAS, This gifted musician performed with such stars as 14 Kirk Franklin and Yolanda Adams, and used his talents to reach out others, sharing his faith, providing encouragement, 15 to and 16 mentoring young people, including recording artist Greg O'Quin; he was instrumental in organizing the Dallas Mass Choir in 1988 and 17 recorded "More Like Jesus" with that group; at the time of his 18 passing in October 2008, he was a musician at Mayo Chapel Methodist 19 20 Church; and

21 WHEREAS, After losing a beloved foster son to gang violence, 22 Mr. Geter redoubled his efforts to help youth through his music; he 23 created the musical drama Young Brother, You're Not Alone, and 24 wrote the title song for the play Don't Throw Your Life Away, which

1 also became the title track of his own CD release; in addition, he 2 established Geter Enterprises Outreach Ministries and the Give a 3 Child a Chance Foundation, and hosted such events as a talent show, 4 a children's gospel concert, and a concert to promote resistance to 5 gangs; and

6 WHEREAS, Serious illness beset Mr. Geter for many years, but 7 he never flagged in his resolve to help others and used his small 8 disability income to create and support events that gave children opportunities to shine; his Kids Day in the Park events grew so 9 10 popular that local ministries and community organizations began to join forces with him to bring even more people together through 11 12 these festivities; Mr. Geter turned his own birthdays into celebrations for children, and he helped students at his former 13 14 school, T. G. Terry Elementary, by returning to give motivational 15 talks; and

16 WHEREAS, For more than two decades, Mr. Geter volunteered at 17 South Dallas and Cedar Hill nursing homes; moreover, he collaborated with staff at Cedar Valley College to provide programs 18 19 and presented workshops in San Antonio, New York, Philadelphia, and other cities around the country; when he received a diagnosis of 20 aggressive cancer, he brushed off any suggestion that he should 21 take more time for himself; and 22

23 WHEREAS, Even as his strength waned, Derrick Geter continued 24 to do whatever he could to make his community a better place, and 25 his generosity, compassion, and determination will forever inspire 26 all those who were fortunate enough to know him; now, therefore, be 27 it
