## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The city of San Antonio lost a distinguished citizen 2 with the death of General Robert Tralles Herres on July 24, 2008, at 3 the age of 75; and

WHEREAS, Robert Herres was born in Denver in 1932 to F. Willard and Edna Herres; after graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1954, he entered the U.S. Air Force; and

7 WHEREAS, This outstanding officer's early career in the Air 8 Force included assignments as a fighter pilot, an air electronics 9 maintenance officer, a flying instructor, and a technical 10 intelligence analyst; and

11 WHEREAS, After graduating from the Aerospace Research Pilot 12 School, General Herres was assigned to the Manned Orbiting 13 Laboratory as a crew member in 1967; he went on to command the 449th 14 Bombardment Wing, the 310th Strategic Wing, the Air Force 15 Communications Command, and the 8th Air Force of the Strategic Air 16 Command; and

WHEREAS, General Herres became commander of the North American Aerospace Defense Command and the U.S. Air Force Space Ocmmand in 1984, and the following year he became the first commander-in-chief of the U.S. Space Command; in 1987, he became vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the second-ranking officer in the U.S. military, a position he held until his retirement in 1990; and

24 WHEREAS, Over the course of his exemplary military career,

General Herres earned the Bronze Star, the Defense Distinguished
Service Medal, the Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit
with oak leaf cluster, and many other commendations; and

4 WHEREAS, In 1990, General Herres went to work for USAA in San Antonio, becoming chair and CEO of the company in 1993, and he 5 expanded coverage to encompass enlisted men and women before 6 7 retiring in 2002; he benefited many worthy organizations with his leadership as well, serving on the national boards of the Boy Scouts 8 of America, Junior Achievement, and the U.S. Naval Academy 9 10 Foundation; he led the annual campaign for the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County, and he also served on the boards of VRTX 11 Technologies, Trinity University, and Austin Presbyterian Seminary 12 13 and was an elder at First Presbyterian Church; and

14 WHEREAS, Robert Herres dedicated his life to the service of 15 his fellow citizens, and memories of this remarkable man will live 16 forever in the hearts of all those who were privileged to know him; 17 now, therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas 19 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of General Robert T. 20 Herres and extend sincere condolences to the members of his family, 21 whom he deeply loved: to his wife of 51 years, Shirley Herres; to 22 his children, Julie Latenser, Michael Herres, and Jennifer Babeon; 23 to his 10 grandchildren; and to his other relatives and friends; 24 and, be it further
