- 13 after his discharge from the air force the couple lived in West
- 14 Virginia, where he worked first for the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad
- 15 and then at Allegheny Ballistics Laboratory; and
- WHEREAS, In 1962, Mr. Mangold and his wife moved to San
- 17 Antonio, where he attended San Antonio College, majoring in public
- 18 speaking, economics, and business administration; during his time
- 19 at the college, he won praise for his innovative ideas for reducing
- 20 the amount of plastic litter along roadways; he later went to work
- 21 in the Mech-Tech department at Kelly Air Force Base, and he earned
- 22 awards on two occasions for his money-saving ideas; and
- WHEREAS, While continuing his employment at Kelly AFB, Mr.

- 2 1999, he served as an assistant for councilman and then mayor Ed
