R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, On April 2, 2009, San Antonio businessman Roberto  
2 Gonzales reopened his garage, Advanced First Auto and Collision  
3 Center, in a new location in order to save the jobs of his  
4 employees; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Donna, Mr. Gonzales learned the values  
6 of hard work and concern for others growing up in a family of  
7 farmworkers; when he was 19, he settled near Detroit, Michigan,  
8 where he took a job as a welder for General Motors and also worked  
9 for several small auto repair shops; and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Gonzales moved back to Texas and opened his own  
11 repair shop in San Antonio in 1987 with little more than \$5,000 and  
12 a jack; with the help of loyal and dedicated employees, he built the  
13 business into Advanced First Auto, specializing in restoring  
14 classic cars and hot rods; and

15 WHEREAS, Recently, at the age of 63, Mr. Gonzales had the  
16 opportunity to retire when he sold the business for a considerable  
17 profit, but he realized how hard it might be for his employees to  
18 find other jobs in this difficult economy; as a result, he purchased  
19 a new location and kept his employees on the payroll during the  
20 monthlong transition to the new shop; and

21 WHEREAS, This act of generosity and loyalty is but one  
22 example of the ethical nature and good business sense of Roberto  
23 Gonzales, and he may indeed take great pride in his many notable  
24 accomplishments; now, therefore, be it
