16 director of the Rosa Mexicano and Maria Maria restaurants; a member
17 of the Gourmet Institute, he is acclaimed around the world as an
18 ambassador for Mexican cooking; and

20 cuisine contribute greatly to American culture overall, and Mr.
21 Santibanez merits special acclaim for his achievements and for
22 setting an outstanding example for the next generation of Latino
