- 1 WHEREAS, Keeping Texas children and youth healthy ensures a
- 2 strong future for the Lone Star State, and the CHIP program promotes
- 3 health in children through preventative care, regular check-ups,
- 4 immunizations, and other critical services; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The federal government created the State Children's
- 6 Health Insurance Program in 1997 to provide health coverage to
- 7 children in uninsured families who earn too much to qualify for
- 8 Medicaid but too little to afford private health coverage; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The 76th Texas Legislature created CHIP in 1999 as a
- 10 statewide program for children in families earning less than 200
- 11 percent of the federal poverty level and who otherwise would not
- 12 have health care coverage; CHIP began serving the state's children
- 13 in April of the following year; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The program provides young Texans with access to a
- 15 range of affordable medical services, among them doctor and dental
- 16 visits, vaccinations, hospital care, mental health treatment,
- 17 vision care, and lab tests, as well as prescription drugs and
- 18 medical supplies; moreover, Texas CHIP covers treatment for special
- 19 needs, including preexisting conditions; and
- WHEREAS, The state's CHIP perinatal program is for residents
- 21 who are pregnant and unable to afford or receive other health
- 22 coverage and offers prenatal care, hospital deliveries, postnatal
- 23 care, and check-ups and vaccines for infants; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Since the inception of Texas CHIP, the state has

- 1 provided access to health services for nearly one million more
- 2 children than had access just over a decade ago; today, Texas CHIP
- 3 provides comprehensive, affordable health coverage to meet the
- 4 medical, dental, visual, and mental health needs of nearly 500,000
- 5 children; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Health care is essential to the development and
- 7 growth of children and youth, and Texas CHIP contributes
- 8 tremendously to the peace of mind of hardworking parents throughout
- 9 the state; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
- 11 Legislature hereby commemorate the 10th anniversary of Texas CHIP
- 12 and commend all those involved in overseeing and administering the
- 13 program.
