1 WHEREAS, The caring and purposeful life of Douglas Allison

Carmichael of Austin drew to a close on May 7, 2009, at the age of

WHEREAS, Born on June 21, 1949, in Berkeley, California, Doug

5 Carmichael was the son of Donald and Pat Carmichael; he answered his

6 nation's call to duty in 1969 and was a medic for the U.S. Army 101st

7 Airborne Division during the Vietnam War; he went on to earn both a

8 bachelor's degree and a medical degree from the University of New

9 Mexico, and along the way, he returned to the military as a member

10 of the Army Reserve; he received advanced training in chemical and

11 biological casualty care and later served as an instructor in

12 advanced trauma and cardiac life support for the U.S. Army Command

13 and General Staff College-Medical Corps; and

14 WHEREAS, After completing his residency in general surgery

and emergency medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin in

16 Milwaukee in 1987, Dr. Carmichael served for a year as a staff

17 emergency medicine physician at Brownwood Regional Hospital in

18 Texas; he subsequently served as commander of the 375th Medical

19 Detachment in Saudi Arabia and as a staff emergency physician at

20 Darnall Army Hospital; moreover, he actively participated in

21 several campaigns, including Operation Desert Storm, before

22 retiring from the Army Reserve with the rank of lieutenant colonel;

24 WHEREAS, In 2000, following service on the emergency medical

- 1 staff of Round Rock Hospital, Dr. Carmichael retired from the
- 2 full-time practice of emergency medicine, however he remained in
- 3 the field as a registered medical sonographer; he provided
- 4 ultrasound instruction to emergency physicians, and he later went
- 5 back to treating patients part-time at Austin area urgent care
- 6 centers; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Dr. Carmichael gave back to his profession as a
- 8 member of numerous organizations; during medical school, he was
- 9 elected as a student member of the American Medical Association,
- 10 and in 1983, he was a student delegate to the AMA House of
- 11 Delegates; as his career progressed, he joined the Texas Medical
- 12 Association, which he served as chair of the TMA Committee on Trauma
- 13 and EMS, and the Texas College of Emergency Physicians, which he
- 14 served as a member of the membership and legislative committees; he
- 15 was honored with a Council Teamwork Award, and he was selected as a
- 16 fellow of the American College of Emergency Physicians; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Dr. Carmichael was an avid distance runner and
- 18 bicyclist who took great pleasure in the outdoors; although he was
- 19 diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in 1995, he continued to pursue
- 20 physical activity and especially enjoyed taking part in two major
- 21 MS fund-raisers, the BP MS 150 bike ride from Austin to Houston and
- 22 the MS 150 Bike to the Beach from San Antonio to Corpus Christi; he
- 23 and some friends founded the Champions Against MS team for
- 24 participants who were struggling with the disease themselves, and
- 25 members were recognizable in their orange, black, and white jerseys
- 26 that read "I have MS That is Why I Ride"; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Throughout his life, Doug Carmichael distinguished

- 1 himself as a talented physician, a patriotic American, and a
- 2 devoted friend and loved one, and memories of him will forever be
- 3 cherished by all those who held him dear; now, therefore, be it
