2 Alexander McIntosh of Houston suffered an immeasurable loss with
3 the death of this courageous young man on March 10, 2008, at the age
4 of 26; and

5 WHEREAS, Corporal McIntosh was killed while bravely serving
6 his country during combat operations in Iraq as a member of the 1st
7 Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 3rd
8 Infantry Division, based at Fort Stewart, Georgia; and

9 WHEREAS, Born in Humble on February 4, 1982, Scott McIntosh
10 was a valued member of St. Dunstan's Episcopal Church, where he was
11 active in the Senior EYC youth group and served as an acolyte for
12 six years; and

13 WHEREAS, Through his unwavering dedication to duty, honor,
14 and this country, Corporal McIntosh embodied the highest ideals of
15 the armed services, and the memory of his love and friendship will
16 be forever treasured by those who were privileged to know him; now,
17 therefore, be it

19 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of U.S. Army Corporal
20 Scott Alexander McIntosh and extend deepest sympathy to the members
