1           WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the heartache felt  
2 at the loss of U.S. Army Reserve Corporal Dustin Ryan Brisky of  
3 Round Rock, who died on June 14, 2007, at the age of 26; and

4           WHEREAS, A native of the Lone Star State, Corporal Brisky was  
5 born in Austin on June 8, 1981; he graduated from McNeil High School  
6 in 1999 and began his military tenure five years later; and

7           WHEREAS, In October 2006, this courageous young Texan  
8 volunteered to go to Iraq so that he could serve beside his fellow  
9 soldiers; he was mortally wounded while serving in Tallil, Iraq;  
10 and

11           WHEREAS, Americans owe a profound debt to our nation's  
12 servicemen and servicewomen, whose love for their country inspires  
13 them to take up military service, and their dedicated efforts and  
14 enormous sacrifices are deserving of their fellow citizens' deepest  
15 respect and gratitude; and

16           WHEREAS, Exemplifying the highest ideals of the U.S. armed  
17 forces, Dustin Brisky inspired others with his fortitude, tenacity,  
18 and courage; although his death has left a void in the lives of his  
19 loved ones, they carry their memories of him close in their hearts;  
20 now, therefore, be it

21           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas  
22 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Corporal Dustin Ryan  
23 Brisky and extend deepest sympathy to the members of his family: to  
24 his mother and stepfather, Karen and Bob Baker; to his father, Bob
