

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Douglas Matthews has long been a valued supporter of
2 the celebration of Juneteenth in Galveston; and

3 WHEREAS, An official state holiday since 1980, Juneteenth
4 commemorates an important milestone in human rights in Texas, the
5 first reading of the Emancipation Proclamation in Galveston on June
6 19, 1865, by Union general Gordon Granger, which effectively freed
7 the 250,000 slaves in Texas at the end of the Civil War; and

8 WHEREAS, Douglas Matthews is assistant vice president for
9 government relations at The University of Texas Medical Branch in
10 Galveston; a leading member of his profession, he has also
11 distinguished himself through his energetic participation in a
12 number of community organizations and activities; and

13 WHEREAS, This public-spirited citizen serves as chairman of
14 the State Juneteenth Advisory Committee, which is responsible for
15 designing and constructing two state Juneteenth monuments; in
16 addition, he is Galveston coordinator of Juneteenth USA and
17 contributes to the Ashton Villa Juneteenth Celebration, now in its
18 30th year, and the Al Edwards Juneteenth Banquet, celebrating its
19 13th year in 2009; and

20 WHEREAS, Through his ongoing leadership, Mr. Matthews has
21 helped to ensure a continued awareness of this landmark event, not
22 only in Galveston but also across the state; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
24 Legislature hereby commend Douglas Matthews for his notable support
