R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The family and friends of U.S. Army Sergeant Chris
2 Davis of Lubbock suffered an immeasurable loss with the death of
3 this valiant soldier in Iraq on June 23, 2007, at the age of 35; and

4 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 69th Armor Regiment,
5 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, out of Fort
6 Benning, Georgia, Sergeant Davis was killed in Baghdad when his
7 unit was attacked by insurgents; and

8 WHEREAS, Chris Davis was born in Lubbock on October 25, 1971,
9 to Raymond and Hermina Davis; a graduate of Estacado High School, he
10 enlisted in the Army in 1999 and served four tours of duty in Iraq;

12 WHEREAS, Sergeant Davis's medals and commendations included
13 the Army Commendation Medal, three Army Achievement Medals, the
14 Army Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the
15 Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, and many
16 others; and

17 WHEREAS, Beloved by his family for his good humor and high
18 spirits, he dedicated his life to the service of his family and his
19 nation, inspiring others with his leadership and courage; although
20 his death has left a void in the lives of his loved ones, they will
21 forever carry his memory close in their hearts; now, therefore, be

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 81st Texas
24 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Sergeant Chris Davis

1 and extend sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his
2 wife, Debbie Davis; to his parents, Raymond and Hermina Davis; to

4 Christian Davis; to his stepson, Zachary Davis; to his brothers,
