1 WHEREAS, The family and friends of United States Army 2 Specialist Rodney L. McCandless sustained a devastating loss with 3 the death of this courageous soldier on April 7, 2007, at the age of 4 21; and

5 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 5th Squadron, 73rd Cavalry Regiment, 6 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division in Fort Bragg, 7 North Carolina, Specialist McCandless was killed by an improvised 8 explosive device in Zaganiyah, Iraq; and

9 WHEREAS, Rodney McCandless joined the army in August 2005 and subsequently completed advanced individual training and the basic 10 airborne course; he was a highly decorated soldier who received the 11 Bronze Star Medal, the Purple Heart, the Army Achievement Medal 12 with one oak leaf cluster, the National Defense Service Medal, the 13 Iraqi Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, 14 the Army Service Ribbon, the Combat Action Badge, and the 15 16 Parachutist Badge; and

WHEREAS, Our state and nation are fortunate to have men and women whose love for their country inspires them to volunteer for military service, yet the tragic death of this brave young man is a sobering reminder of the cost of war; Specialist McCandless embodied the highest ideals of the U.S. armed forces, and those who knew and loved him will forever carry him close in their hearts; now, therefore, be it
