1 WHEREAS, The family and friends of United States Army Staff 2 Sergeant Eric Thomas Duckworth sustained a heavy loss with the death of this courageous soldier in Iraq on October 10, 2007, at the 3 age of 26; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 759th Military Police Battalion, 89th Military Police Brigade, and based at Fort Carson, Colorado, 6 7 Sergeant Duckworth deployed to Iraq in August 2006 for a 15-month tour of duty, during which he worked to train Iraqi police; he was 8 9 mortally wounded while leading a convoy in the city of Baghdad; and WHEREAS, Eric Duckworth was born in Dallas on October 30, 10 11 1980, and grew up in Plano, where he played youth baseball and 12 football; he attended Plano East High School during his senior year and graduated from Clear Lake High School in Houston in 1999; from 13 14 the time he was a boy, Sergeant Duckworth aspired to serve in both the military and law enforcement, and he got an early start on his 15 career path in high school as a stellar member of the Army JROTC; 16 17 and WHEREAS, Sergeant Duckworth enlisted in the armed forces at 18 the age of 18 and served initially in the infantry; during his eight 19 20 years in the military, he excelled at his work and won the deep 21 respect of his commanding officers and comrades for his consummate professionalism, his even temperament and composure under stress, 22 23 and his unfailing readiness to lend a helping hand; admired for his outstanding qualities as a soldier, he was no less treasured for the 24

- 3 WHEREAS, A passionate sports fan, Sergeant Duckworth was a
- 4 keen NASCAR enthusiast and yielded to no one in his devotion to the

- 6 WHEREAS, Above all, Eric Duckworth loved his wife, Sonya, his
- 7 stepdaughter, Kaylynn, and his children, Madison and Michael; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In his dedication to duty, honor, and this country,
- 9 Sergeant Eric Duckworth exemplified the highest ideals of the
- 10 United States armed forces, and those who were blessed to share in
- 11 the richness of his life will forever carry him close in their
