Baylor Health Care System in Dallas, has received the 2008 Earl M.

5 WHEREAS, Established in 1965, the Collier Award is the 6 highest bestowed by the THA, one of the largest hospital 7 associations in the country; the award acknowledges the leadership 8 qualities exemplified by its namesake, who is regarded as the dean 9 of hospital administration in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Allison graduated from Baylor University and 10 11 went on to earn a master's degree in health care administration from 12 Trinity University, later also completing the advanced management program at Harvard Business School; he began his career in health 13 14 care as an intern at Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene and within six years had risen to become executive vice president and chief 15 operating officer; in 1981, he accepted a position in his native 16 Missouri and began to build a reputation as an exceptionally able 17 strategic manager in turnaround situations; and 18

WHEREAS, After heading hospitals in Amarillo and Corpus Christi, Mr. Allison joined Baylor Health Care System in 1993 as senior executive vice president and chief operating officer; seven years later, he was promoted to the top post of this growing network of hospitals, primary and specialty care centers, and rehabilitation clinics; using his experience at the cutting edge of

1 change, he has further developed Baylor's commitment to 2 patient-focused health care and clinical enterprise; in addition to 3 establishing a quality initiative for the system, which has more 4 than 16,000 employees and 2,800 physicians, he has increased its 5 emphasis on medical education and health care research; and

6 WHEREAS, The numerous accolades accorded Mr. Allison include 7 an honorary doctorate in humanities from Dallas Baptist University; Modern Healthcare has named him one of the "100 Most Powerful People 8 in Healthcare" for the past four years and recognized him in 2005 9 10 with the CEO IT Achievement Award; moreover, Baylor University selected him as its Distinguished Alumnus in 2004 and he has 11 12 received the Leonard A. Duce Award from the Trinity University 13 Healthcare Alumni Association; and

14 WHEREAS, A fellow of the American College of Healthcare 15 Executives, Mr. Allison serves on the Healthcare Leadership Council, the National Quality Forum, and the international board of 16 17 United Surgical Partners; he also serves on numerous state and for professional 18 local boards associations and civic 19 organizations, among them VHA Texas, the Dallas Citizens Council, and the Dallas Regional Chamber; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Joel Allison has demonstrated remarkable vision and 22 skill throughout more than three decades as a health care 23 administrator, and his energy, enthusiasm, and dedication to 24 excellence are an inspiration to all; now, therefore, be it
