2009, at the age of 93; and WHEREAS, A native of Tennessee, Mrs. Sturgis grew up 4 5 Memphis and attended Mars Hill College before transferring to Baylor University to earn degrees in English and education; she met 6 7 Carroll Sturgis while at Baylor and married him in 1937; the couple,

who would go on to share 64 years together, made their home in Waco, 8

9 and Mrs. Sturgis lovingly raised their children, Elinor and

Carroll, while substitute teaching and participating in a number of 10

11 civic organizations; among the many offices she held were president

12 of the Junior League of Waco, the YWCA, and the Waco Literary Club 13

and chair of the Art Center board of trustees, the Brazos River 14 Festival, and the Women's Division of the United Way; she also

served on the Historic Waco Foundation board and the Waco City 15

WHEREAS, Later in life, Mrs. Sturgis joined the environmental 17 task force of the Greater Waco Chamber of Commerce and became 18 founding chair of Keep Waco Beautiful, and her passion for 19 enhancing the physical landscape of her city would define her 20 21 remaining years; under her leadership, the staff and more than 11,000 volunteers of the organization initiated 22 over 23 environmental and beautification projects in the community; in addition to her efforts to create Art Center Waco, Miss Nellie's 24

- 1 Pretty Place, and Heritage Square, Mrs. Sturgis is credited with
- 2 transforming the once-overgrown banks of the Brazos into the
- 3 inviting community gathering place that is Indian Spring Park, and
- 4 this initiative is cited as a turning point in the redevelopment of
- 5 downtown Waco; and
