RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of Texas, 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, That House Rule 13, Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to resolve the differences on Senate Bill 1182 (public information and open government) to consider and take action on the following matter:

8 House Rule 13, Sections 9(a)(3) and (4), are suspended to 9 permit the committee to add SECTIONS 4 and 13 to the bill:

10 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is 11 amended by adding Section 552.151 to read as follows:

Sec. 552.151. EXCEPTION: INFORMATION REGARDING SELECT AGENTS. (a) The following information that pertains to a biological agent or toxin identified or listed as a select agent under federal law, including under the Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002 (Pub. L. No. 17 107-188) and regulations adopted under that Act, is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021:

19 (1) the specific location of a select agent within an 20 approved facility;

21 (2) personal identifying information of an individual 22 whose name appears in documentation relating to the chain of 23 custody of select agents, including a materials transfer agreement; 24 and

No. 2880 (3) the identity of an individual authorized to 1 possess, use, or access a select agent. 2 3 (b) This section does not except from disclosure the identity of the select agents present at a facility. 4 (c) This section does not except from disclosure the 5 identity of an individual faculty member or employee whose name 6 7 appears or will appear on published research. 8 (d) This section does not except from disclosure otherwise public information relating to contracts of a governmental body. 9 (e) If a resident of another state is present in Texas and is 10 authorized to possess, use, or access a select agent in conducting 11 12 research or other work at a Texas facility, information relating to the identity of that individual is subject to disclosure under this 13 14 chapter only to the extent the information would be subject to 15 disclosure under the laws of the state of which the person is a resident. 16 SECTION 13. Section 552.151, Government Code, as added by 17 this Act, applies in relation to: 18 a request for public information under Chapter 19 (1) 552, Government Code, made before, on, or after the effective date 20 21 of this Act; and (2) information that on the effective date of this Act 22 23 has not yet been disclosed that: 24 (A) was the subject of a request for information 25 made before the effective date of this Act; and (B) the attorney general determined before the 26 27 effective date of this Act to be subject to disclosure under Chapter
