- 19 Association, the Texas Daily Newspaper Association, the National
- 20 Newspaper Association, and American Court and Commercial
- 21 Newspapers, Inc.; he was also a member of the TDNA/TPA legislative
- 22 advisory committee; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Morin wrote not only news stories but also
- 24 poetry and prose, and he had recently completed a comprehensive

- 1 genealogy on the Morin family; his strong religious faith led him to
- 2 serve as an elder in several congregations and lead services at area
- 3 retirement communities; a voracious reader who favored the Bible
- 4 and history books, he also enjoyed woodworking, traveling, and
