RESOLUTION

- BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of
- 2 Texas, 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, That House Rule 13,
- 3 Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13,
- 4 Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to
- 5 resolve the differences on House Bill 3, relating to public school
- 6 accountability, curriculum, and promotion requirements, to
- 7 consider and take action on the following matters:
- 8 (1) House Rule 13, Sections 9(a)(1), (2), and (4), are
- 9 suspended to permit the committee to change and omit text not in
- 10 disagreement and to add text on a matter not included in either
- 11 version of the bill, in SECTION 1 of the bill, in Section 7.009,
- 12 Education Code, to read as follows:
- 13 SECTION 1. Section 7.009, Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 7.009. BEST PRACTICES; CLEARINGHOUSE. (a) In
- 16 coordination with the Legislative Budget Board, the agency shall
- 17 establish an online clearinghouse of information relating to best
- 18 practices of campuses, [and] school districts, and open-enrollment
- 19 charter schools. The agency shall determine the appropriate topic
- 20 categories for which a campus, district, or charter school may
- 21 <u>submit best</u> [regarding instruction, dropout prevention, public
- 22 school finance, resource allocation, and business] practices. To
- 23 the extent practicable, the agency shall ensure that information
- 24 provided through the online clearinghouse is specific, actionable

- 1 information relating to the best practices of high-performing and
- 2 highly efficient campuses, [and school] districts, and
- 3 open-enrollment charter schools and of academically acceptable
- 4 campuses, districts, and open-enrollment charter schools that have
- 5 demonstrated significant improvement in student achievement rather
- 6 than general guidelines relating to campus, [and school] district,
- 7 <u>and open-enrollment charter school</u> operation. The information must
- 8 be accessible by campuses, school districts, open-enrollment
- 9 charter schools, and interested members of the public.
- 10 (b) The agency shall solicit and collect from the
- 11 Legislative Budget Board, centers for education research
- 12 established under Section 1.005, and [exemplary or recognized]
- 13 school districts, campuses, and open-enrollment charter schools[$_{ au}$
- 14 $\frac{\text{as rated under Section 39.072}}{\text{r}}$] examples of best practices $\frac{\text{as}}{\text{r}}$
- 15 determined by the agency under Subsection (a) [relating to
- 16 instruction, dropout prevention, public school finance, resource
- 17 allocation, and business practices, including best practices
- 18 relating to curriculum, scope and sequence, compensation and
- 19 incentive systems, bilingual education and special language
- 20 programs, compensatory education programs, and the effective use of
- 21 instructional technology, including online courses].
- (c) The agency shall contract for the services of one or
- 23 more third-party contractors to develop, implement, and maintain a
- 24 system of collecting and evaluating the best practices of campuses,
- 25 [and] school districts, and open-enrollment charter schools as
- 26 provided by this section. In addition to any other considerations
- 27 required by law, the agency must consider an applicant's

- 1 demonstrated competence and qualifications in analyzing campus,
- 2 [and] school district, and open-enrollment charter school
- 3 practices in awarding a contract under this subsection.
- 4 (d) The commissioner may purchase from available funds
- 5 curriculum and other instructional tools identified under this
- 6 section to provide for use by school districts <u>and open-enrollment</u>
- 7 charter schools.
- 8 Explanation: The alteration of text is necessary to permit
- 9 school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to submit best
- 10 practices in any relevant area, to clarify that a third-party
- 11 contractor may collect and evaluate best practices submitted by
- 12 open-enrollment charter schools, and to clarify that the
- 13 commissioner of education may purchase curriculum and other
- 14 instructional tools to provide for use by open-enrollment charter
- 15 schools.
- 16 (2) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(2), is suspended to permit
- 17 the committee to omit text not in disagreement, in SECTION 25 of the
- 18 bill, in amended Section 28.002, Education Code, to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 <u>(c-2)</u> The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to
- 21 <u>authorize each school district to implement a program under which</u>
- 22 students in middle or junior high school may earn credits toward
- 23 high school graduation in middle or junior high school for any
- 24 course determined by board rule to qualify as a high school
- 25 equivalent course.
- Explanation: The omission of text is necessary to remove the
- 27 requirement directing the State Board of Education to adopt rules

- 1 to authorize school district programs to allow middle or junior
- 2 high school students to earn high school credit.
- 3 (3) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(2), is suspended to permit
- 4 the committee to omit text not in disagreement, in SECTION 27 of the
- 5 bill, in amended Section 28.014(d), Education Code, to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (d) The agency, in coordination with the Texas Higher
- 8 Education Coordinating Board, shall adopt a series of questions to
- 9 be included in an end-of-course assessment instrument administered
- 10 under Subsection (c) to be used for purposes of Section 51.3062.
- 11 The questions must be developed in a manner consistent with any
- 12 college readiness standards adopted under Sections 39.233 [39.113]
- 13 and 51.3062. [A student's performance on a question adopted under
- 14 this subsection may not be used to determine the student's
- 15 performance on an end-of-course assessment instrument.
- 16 Explanation: The omission of text is necessary to permit a
- 17 student's performance on a specific question related to
- 18 postsecondary readiness on an end-of-course assessment instrument
- 19 to be used to determine the student's performance on the assessment
- 20 instrument.
- 21 (4) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(2), is suspended to permit
- 22 the committee to omit text not in disagreement, in added Section
- 23 28.025(b-5), Education Code, to read as follows:
- 24 (b-5) Notwithstanding Section 5.09, Chapter 5 (H.B. 1),
- 25 79th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2006, the curriculum
- 26 requirements for the recommended and advanced high school programs
- 27 under Subsection (b-1) apply to students entering the ninth grade

- 1 beginning with the 2011-2012 school year. This subsection expires
- 2 September 1, 2015.
- 3 Explanation: The omission of text is necessary to have the
- 4 high school curriculum requirements for the recommended and
- 5 advanced high school programs established under Chapter 5 (H.B. 1),
- 6 79th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2006, apply to students
- 7 entering the ninth grade beginning with the 2007-2008 school year,
- 8 as originally intended.
- 9 (5) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit
- 10 the committee to add text on a matter not included in either version
- 11 of the bill, under SECTION 30 of the bill, in amended Section
- 12 28.025, Education Code, to read as follows:
- 13 (b-7) The agency shall establish a pilot program allowing a
- 14 student attending school in a county with a population of more than
- 15 one million and in which more than 80 percent of the population
- 16 <u>resides in a single municipality to satisfy the fine arts credit</u>
- 17 required under Subsection (b-1)(3)(A) by participating in a fine
- 18 arts program not provided by the school district in which the
- 19 student is enrolled. The fine arts program may be provided on or
- 20 off a school campus and outside the regular school day. Not later
- 21 than December 1, 2010, the agency shall provide to the legislature a
- 22 report regarding the pilot program, including the feasibility of
- 23 <u>expanding the pilot program statewide.</u>
- 24 (b-8) A school district, with the approval of the
- 25 commissioner, may allow a student to comply with the curriculum
- 26 requirements for the physical education credit required under
- 27 Subsection (b-1)(3)(B) by participating in a private or

- 1 commercially sponsored physical activity program provided on or off
- 2 a school campus and outside the regular school day.
- 3 Explanation: The additions are necessary to establish a fine
- 4 arts pilot program and to establish an alternative method for
- 5 meeting the physical education credit requirement.
- 6 (6) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit
- 7 the committee to add the following SECTION to the bill on a matter
- 8 not included in either version of the bill to read as follows:
- 9 SECTION 52. Section 39.0234(a), Education Code, is amended
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The agency shall ensure that assessment instruments
- 12 required under Section 39.023 are capable of being administered by
- 13 computer. The commissioner may not require a school district or
- 14 open-enrollment charter school to administer an assessment
- 15 <u>instrument by computer.</u>
- 16 Explanation: This addition is necessary to prohibit
- 17 mandatory administration of assessment instruments by computer.
- 18 (7) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit
- 19 the committee to add text on a matter not included in either version
- 20 of the bill, under SECTION 59 of the bill, in proposed Section
- 21 39.057(a), Education Code, to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The commissioner shall authorize special accreditation
- 23 investigations to be conducted:
- 24 . . .
- 25 (12) when resource allocation practices as evaluated
- 26 <u>under Section 39.0821 indicate a potential for significant</u>
- 27 improvement in resource allocation; or . . .

- 1 Explanation: This addition is necessary to authorize a
- 2 special accreditation investigation when the comptroller has
- 3 identified the potential for significant improvement in resource
- 4 allocation exists at a school district or campus.
- 5 (8) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit
- 6 the committee to add text on a matter not included in either version
- 7 of the bill, under SECTION 59 of the bill, in added Section 39.0821,
- 8 Education Code, to read as follows:
- 9 (b) In reviewing resources allocation practices of
- 10 districts and campuses under this section, the comptroller shall
- 11 ensure resources are being used for the instruction of students by
- 12 evaluating:
- 13 (1) the operating cost for each student;
- 14 (2) the operating cost for each program; and
- 15 (3) the staffing cost for each student.
- 16 Explanation: The addition is necessary to ensure school
- 17 district and campus resources are being used for the instruction of
- 18 students.
