4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.223 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.223. STUDENTS VOLUNTEERING FOR OUTREACH PROGRAMS.
8	(a) The governing board of an institution of higher education may
9	exempt from the payment of tuition and fees for one course offered
10	by the institution per semester or other term any student enrolled
11	in the institution who:
12	(1) is 55 years of age or older;
13	(2) is a resident of this state for purposes of this
14	title or entitled to pay tuition at the rate provided by this
15	chapter for residents of this state; and
16	(3) serves as a volunteer for at least 10 hours per
17	week or 40 hours per month for an outreach, mentoring, or
18	recruitment program that is designed to assist or encourage:
19	(A) high school students to be admitted to and
20	attend institutions of higher education; or
21	(B) students who are currently enrolled in
22	institutions of higher education to complete their degree programs.
23	(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
24	adopt rules necessary for the administration of this section.

S.B. No. 46 SECTION 2. (a) Section 54.223, Education Code, as added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2010 fall semester.

3 (b) Not later than January 1, 2010, the Texas Higher 4 Education Coordinating Board shall adopt the initial rules required 5 by Section 54.223, Education Code, as added by this Act.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
