- 10 offense under this section, the offense is punishable by:
- 11 (1) a fine of not less than \$500 [\$300] or more than
- 12 \$800; and
- 13 (2) 10 hours of community service [\$600].
- 14 (i) If it is shown on the trial of an offense under this
- 15 section that the person has been previously convicted two times of
- 16 an offense under this section, the offense is punishable by:
- 17 (1) a fine of not less than \$550 [\$300] or more than
- 18 \$800 [\$600]; and
- 19 (2) [not less than 10 or more than] 20 hours of
- 20 community service.
- 21 (j) If it is shown on the trial of an offense under this
- 22 section that the person has been previously convicted three times
- 23 of an offense under this section, the offense is punishable by:
- 24 (1) a fine of not less than $\$800 \ [\$500]$ or more than

- 1 \$1,100 [\$1,000]; and
- 2 (2) $\underline{30}$ [not less than 20 or more than 50] hours \underline{of}
- 3 community service.
- 4 (k) If it is shown on the trial of an offense under this
- 5 section that the person has been previously convicted four times of
- 6 an offense under this section, the offense is punishable by a fine
- 7 of \$1,250 [\$1,000] and 50 hours of community service.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 681.012, Transportation Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) and amending Subsection (b)
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 <u>(a-1) A peace officer may seize a disabled parking placard</u>
- 12 from a person who operates a vehicle on which a disabled parking
- 13 placard is displayed if the peace officer determines by inspecting
- 14 the person's driver's license or personal identification
- 15 certificate that the disabled parking placard does not contain the
- 16 first four digits of the driver's license number or personal
- 17 identification certificate number and the initials of:
- 18 (1) the person operating the vehicle; or
- 19 (2) a person being transported by the vehicle.
- 20 <u>(a-2)</u> A peace officer shall submit each seized parking
- 21 placard to the department not later than the fifth day after the
- 22 <u>seizure.</u>
- 23 (b) On submission to the department under Subsection (a) or
- 24 (a-2), a placard is revoked. On request of the person from whom the
- 25 placard was seized, the department shall conduct a hearing and
- 26 determine whether the revocation should continue or the placard
- 27 should be returned to the person and the revocation rescinded.

- 1 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 2 only to an offense committed on or after September 1, 2009.
- 3 (b) An offense committed before September 1, 2009, is
- 4 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 5 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 6 this subsection, an offense was committed before September 1, 2009,
- 7 if any element of the offense was committed before that date.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
