The governor shall designate a member of the research (c) committee as the presiding officer of the research oversight oversight committee. The presiding officer serves in that capacity at the will of the governor.

The members of the research oversight committee serve six-year terms, with four members' terms expiring (d) staggered February 1 of each odd-numbered year. If a vacancy occurs on the research oversight committee, the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint, in the same manner as the original appointment, another person to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

(e) A research oversight committee member is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in performing the duties of a research oversight committee member.

Sec. 156.004. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. (a) In this section,

If the research oversight committee does not carry out a recommendation of the advisory committee, the research oversight committee shall provide a reason to the advisory committee in writing and include the reason in its biennial report.
