A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to swimming pool and spa safety.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 761 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 761. SWIMMING POOL AND SPA SAFETY BARRIERS AND ENTRAPMENT
7	AVOIDANCE
8	Sec. 761.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "ASME/ANSI" means a standard that is accredited by
10	the American National Standards Institute and published by the
11	American Society of Mechanical Engineers.
12	(2) "ASTM" means a standard that is accredited by the
13	American Society For Testing and Materials.
14	(3) "Barrier" includes:
15	(A) a natural or constructed topographical
16	feature that prevents unauthorized access by children to a swimming
17	<pre>pool or spa;</pre>
18	(B) for a hot tub, a lockable cover; and
19	(C) a manual cover that meets all requirements of
20	the ASTM Specifications F1346-91 "Standard Performance
21	Specification for Safety Covers and Labeling Requirements for All
22	Covers for Swimming Pools, Spas and Hot Tubs."
23	(4) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
24	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.

- 1 (5) "Main drain" means a submerged suction outlet
- 2 typically located at the bottom of a swimming pool or spa to
- 3 transfer water from the swimming pool or spa to a recirculating
- 4 pump.
- 5 (6) "Safety vacuum release system" means a vacuum
- 6 release system capable of providing vacuum release at a suction
- 7 outlet caused by a high vacuum occurrence due to a flow blockage.
- 8 <u>(7) "Swimming pool or spa" means any outdoor or indoor</u>
- 9 structure intended for swimming or recreational bathing, including
- 10 inground and aboveground structures. The term includes nonportable
- 11 wading pools.
- 12 (8) "Unblockable drain" means a drain of any size and
- 13 shape that a human body cannot sufficiently block to create a
- 14 suction entrapment hazard.
- 15 Sec. 761.002. DRAIN STANDARD AND REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT.
- 16 (a) A swimming pool or spa drain installed or sold in this state on
- 17 or after September 1, 2009, must conform to the entrapment
- 18 protection standards of the ASME/ANSI Standard A112.19.8 "Suction
- 19 Fittings for Use in Swimming Pools, Wading Pools, Spas, and Hot
- 20 Tubs" or a successor standard regulating the swimming pool or spa
- 21 drain cover that is adopted by the executive commissioner, in
- 22 conjunction with the United States Consumer Product Safety
- 23 Commission, as being at least as stringent as the Al12.19.8
- 24 performance standard.
- 25 (b) A swimming pool or spa installed or constructed on or
- 26 <u>after September 1, 2009, in this state must:</u>
- 27 (1) have one of the following:

1	(A) more than one drain;
2	(B) one or more unblockable drains; or
3	(C) no main drain; and
4	(2) at a minimum, be equipped with one or more of the
5	following devices or systems designed to prevent entrapment by
6	swimming pool or spa drains in accordance with the following
7	requirements:
8	(A) a safety vacuum release system that:
9	(i) is tested by an independent third
10	<pre>party;</pre>
11	(ii) stops operation of a pump, reverses
12	the circulation flow, or otherwise provides a vacuum release at a
13	blocked suction outlet; and
14	(iii) conforms to the ASME/ANSI Standard
15	A112.19.17 "Manufactured Safety Vacuum Release Systems (SVRS) for
16	Residential & Commercial Swimming Pool, Spa, Hot Tub, Wading Pool
17	Suction Systems" or a successor standard that is adopted by the
18	executive commissioner, in conjunction with the United States
19	Consumer Product Safety Commission, as being at least as stringent
20	as the A112.19.17 performance standard;
21	(B) a suction-limiting vent system with a
22	<pre>tamper-resistant atmospheric opening;</pre>
23	(C) a gravity drainage system that uses a
24	<pre>collector tank;</pre>
25	(D) an automatic pump shut-off system;
26	(E) a device or system that disables the drain;
27	<u>or</u>

- 1 (F) any other system determined by the executive
- 2 commissioner to be equally effective as, or better than, the
- 3 systems described in Paragraphs (A)-(E) at preventing or
- 4 eliminating the risk of injury or death associated with swimming
- 5 pool or spa drainage systems.
- 6 (c) A swimming pool or spa with a single main drain, other
- 7 than an unblockable drain, that is remodeled for purposes of repair
- 8 or improvement on or after September 1, 2009, must comply with the
- 9 requirements of Subsection (b).
- 10 (d) A residential swimming pool or spa constructed or
- 11 installed in this state on or after September 1, 2009, other than a
- 12 swimming pool governed by Chapter 757, must be enclosed by barriers
- 13 to entry designed to effectively prevent small children from
- 14 gaining unsupervised and unfettered access to the swimming pool or
- 15 spa.
- 16 <u>(e) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules for</u>
- 17 barriers consistent with the guidelines contained in:
- 18 (1) the <u>United States Consumer Product Safety</u>
- 19 Commission's publication 362 entitled "Safety Barrier Guidelines
- 20 for Home Pools";
- 21 (2) the United States Consumer Product Safety
- 22 <u>Commission's March 2005 publication entitled "Guidelines for</u>
- 23 Entrapment Hazards: Making Pools and Spas Safer"; and
- 24 (3) any other swimming pool and spa safety guidelines
- 25 established by the United States Consumer Product Safety
- 26 Commission.
- 27 (f) A person who sells, constructs, or installs a swimming

- 1 pool or spa in this state shall provide notice to a purchaser of a
- 2 swimming pool or spa of the applicable barrier requirements adopted
- 3 by the executive commissioner under Subsection (e).
- 4 Sec. 761.003. EDUCATION AND NOTIFICATION. The Department
- 5 of State Health Services shall conduct an education program to:
- 6 (1) periodically notify owners of swimming pools or
- 7 spas about the requirements of this chapter and any applicable
- 8 <u>federal statute or safety standard; and</u>
- 9 (2) inform the public of methods to prevent drowning
- 10 and entrapment in swimming pools and spas.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subsection (g), Section 341.064, Health and
- 12 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (g) The construction and appliances of a public swimming
- 14 pool must be such as to reduce to a practical minimum the
- 15 possibility of drowning or of injury to bathers. The construction
- 16 after September 1, 2009 [4, 1945], of a public swimming pool must
- 17 comply with Chapter 761 and conform to good public health
- 18 engineering practices.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 343.011, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:
- 21 (c-1) A swimming pool barrier that satisfies the
- 22 requirements of Chapter 761 satisfies the requirements of
- 23 Subsection (c) with respect to a fence or cover for a swimming pool
- 24 for purposes of determining whether the swimming pool is a public
- 25 <u>nuisance.</u>
- 26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
