3	in South Texas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 74, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter N to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N. THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS HEALTH
8	SCIENCE CENTERSOUTH TEXAS
9	Sec. 74.751. HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER. (a) The board of
10	regents of The University of Texas System may operate The
11	University of Texas Health Science CenterSouth Texas as a
12	component institution of The University of Texas System with its
13	main campus and administrative offices in Cameron County. The
14	health science center may consist of a medical school, as provided
15	by Section 74.752, other health and health-related degree programs,
16	and related programs and facilities as the board considers
17	appropriate.
18	(b) The board of regents may include facilities located in
19	Bee, Brooks, Cameron, Hidalgo, Jim Hogg, Jim Wells, Kenedy,
20	Kleberg, Nueces, Starr, Willacy, and Zapata Counties in the health
21	science center and may operate programs and activities and provide
22	related services of the center in those counties.
23	Sec. 74.752. MEDICAL SCHOOL. If The University of Texas
24	Health Science CenterSouth Texas is established under Section

74.751, The University of Texas Medical School--South Texas may be 1 2 established as a component of the health science center and as a 3 component institution of The University of Texas System under the 4 management and control of the board of regents of The University of 5 Texas System. Sec. 74.753. PARTICIPATION IN AVAILABLE UNIVERSITY FUND. 6 7 In accordance with Section 18(c), Article VII, Texas Constitution, 8 if the Act enacting this section receives a vote of two-thirds of 9 all the members elected to each house of the legislature, and if an institution is established under this subchapter, the institution 10 11 is entitled to participate in the funding provided by Section 18, Article VII, Texas Constitution, for The University of Texas 12 13 System. Sec. 74.754. COURSES AND DEGREES; RULES. The board of 14 regents may prescribe courses leading to customary degrees and may 15 adopt rules for the operation, control, and management of the 16 health science center as may be necessary for the conduct of a 17 medical school and other health science center programs of the 18 first class. 19 20 Sec. 74.755. AFFILIATION AGREEMENTS; JOINT APPOINTMENTS. 21 (a) The board of regents may execute and carry out affiliation or 22 coordination agreements with any other entity or institution in the 23 region. (b) The board of regents may make joint appointments in the 24 health science center, its component institutions, and other 25 institutions under the board's governance. The salary of a person 26 27 who receives a joint appointment shall be apportioned to the

1 appointing institutions on the basis of services rendered.

Sec. 74.756. GIFTS AND GRANTS; OTHER FUNDING. (a) The
board of regents may accept and administer gifts and grants from any
public or private person or entity for the use and benefit of the
health science center and its component institutions.

6 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter, 7 establishment of the health science center is subject to the 8 availability of funding, either through appropriation or from 9 another source.

10 <u>Sec. 74.757. OTHER FACILITIES.</u> In addition to the 11 <u>facilities of the health science center and its component</u> 12 <u>institutions, the board of regents may enter into agreements under</u> 13 <u>which additional facilities used in the center's teaching and</u> 14 <u>research programs, including libraries, auditoriums, research</u> 15 <u>facilities, and medical education buildings, may be provided by a</u> 16 <u>public or private entity.</u>

Sec. 74.758. TEACHING HOSPITAL. A teaching hospital considered suitable by the board of regents for the health science center may be provided by a public or private entity. The hospital may not be constructed, maintained, or operated with state funds.

21 <u>Sec. 74.759. COORDINATING BOARD SUPERVISION.</u> The health 22 <u>science center is subject to the continuing supervision of the</u> 23 <u>Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Chapter 61 and to</u> 24 <u>the rules of the coordinating board adopted under Chapter 61.</u>

25 <u>Sec. 74.760. EFFECT OF HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER ON LOWER RIO</u> 26 <u>GRANDE VALLEY ACADEMIC HEALTH CENTER. (a) The board of regents</u> 27 <u>may convert the regional academic health center established under</u>

Subchapter L into The University of Texas Health Science 1 2 Center--South Texas and may establish The University of Texas Medical School--South Texas at the health science center as soon as 3 4 the board considers appropriate considering available resources and the best interests of The University of Texas System and the 5 people of this state and the South Texas region. In establishing 6 7 the health science center and medical school, the board of regents 8 shall ensure that the programs, students, and faculty and staff of 9 the regional academic health center are not affected other than as the board considers necessary to implement this subchapter. 10

11 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that The University 12 of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its component 13 institutions be established by conversion of the regional academic health center established under Subchapter L and that those 14 entities be considered to be the same institution. A reference in 15 16 law to the regional academic health center applies to The University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas to the 17 extent it can be made applicable. All contracts and agreements, 18 including bonds and other financial obligations, entered into by 19 20 The University of Texas System or any of its officers or employees relating to the regional academic health center apply to The 21 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas when the 22 23 health science center is established.

(c) The permanent endowment fund established under Section
 63.101 for the benefit of the regional academic health center
 established under Subchapter L is transferred to the benefit of The
 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its

component institutions when the health science center is 1 2 established. It is the intent of the legislature that the transfer 3 of the permanent endowment fund be made so as not to interrupt the research or other programs supported by distributions from the 4 5 fund. 6 SECTION 2. Section 55.1732, Education Code, is amended by 7 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: (e) Bonds authorized or issued under this section for the 8 regional academic health center established under Section 74.611 9 are considered to have been authorized or issued for The University 10 of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its component 11 institutions if the health science center is established. 12 13 SECTION 3. Subdivision (5), Section 61.003, Education Code, 14 is amended to read as follows: 15 (5) "Medical and dental unit" means The University of 16 Texas Medical Branch at Galveston; The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas; The University of Texas 17 Medical School at San Antonio; The University of Texas Dental 18 Branch at Houston; The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer 19 Center; The University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical 20 Sciences at Houston; The University of Texas Dental School at San 21 Antonio; The University of Texas Medical School at Houston; The 22 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its 23 component institutions, if established under Subchapter N, Chapter 24 74; the nursing institutions of The University of Texas System; and 25 The University of Texas School of Public Health at Houston; and such 26

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other medical or dental schools as may be established by statute or

as provided in this chapter. 1 SECTION 4. Subsection (c), Section 63.002, Education Code, 2 is amended to read as follows: 3 The amount available for distribution from the fund may 4 (C) be appropriated only for programs that benefit medical research, 5 health education, or treatment programs at the following 6 7 health-related institutions of higher education: The University of Texas Health Science Center at 8 (1)9 San Antonio; 10 (2) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer 11 Center; The University of Texas Southwestern Medical 12 (3) 13 Center at Dallas; University of 14 (4) The Texas Medical Branch at 15 Galveston; 16 (5) The University of Texas Health Science Center at 17 Houston; 18 (6) The University of Texas Health Science Center at Tyler; 19 20 (7) The University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its component institutions, if established 21 under Subchapter N, Chapter 74; 22 (8) The Texas A&M University Health Science Center; 23 24 (9) [(8)] the University of North Texas Health Science 25 Center at Fort Worth; (10) [(9)] the Texas Tech University Health Sciences 26 27 Center; and

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1 (11) [(10)] Baylor College of Medicine, if a contract 2 between Baylor College of Medicine and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is in effect under Section 61.092. 3 SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 65.02, Education Code, 4 is amended to read as follows: 5 The University of Texas System is composed of the 6 (a) 7 following institutions and entities: (1)The University of Texas at Arlington, including: 8 9 (A) The University of Texas Institute of Urban Studies at Arlington; and 10 11 (B) The University of Texas School of Nursing at Arlington; 12 13 (2) The University of Texas at Austin, including: The University of Texas Marine 14 (A) Science 15 Institute; 16 (B) The University of Texas McDonald Observatory at Mount Locke; and 17 18 (C) The University of Texas School of Nursing at Austin; 19 The University of Texas at Dallas; 20 (3) The University of Texas at El Paso, including The 21 (4) University of Texas School of Nursing at El Paso; 22 The University of Texas of the Permian Basin; 23 (5) 24 (6) The University of Texas at San Antonio, including 25 the University of Texas Institute of Texan Cultures at San Antonio; (7) The University of Texas Southwestern Medical 26 27 Center at Dallas, including:

1 The University of Texas Southwestern Medical (A) 2 School at Dallas; (B) The University of Texas 3 Southwestern 4 Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at Dallas; and 5 (C) The University of Texas Southwestern Allied Health Sciences School at Dallas; 6 7 (8) The University of Medical Texas Branch at Galveston, including: 8 9 (A) The University of Texas Medical School at 10 Galveston; 11 (B) The University of Texas Graduate School of 12 Biomedical Sciences at Galveston; 13 (C) The University of Texas School of Allied Health Sciences at Galveston; 14 15 (D) The University of Texas Marine Biomedical 16 Institute at Galveston; 17 (E) The University of Texas Hospitals at Galveston; and 18 (F) The University of Texas School of Nursing at 19 20 Galveston; The University of Texas Health Science Center at 21 (9) Houston, including: 22 The University of Texas Medical School at 23 (A) 24 Houston; 25 (B) The University of Texas Dental Branch at 26 Houston; 27 (C) The University of Texas Graduate School of

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Biomedical Sciences at Houston; 1 2 (D) The University of Texas School of Health Information Sciences at Houston; 3 4 (E) The University of Texas School of Public 5 Health at Houston; 6 (F) The University of Texas Speech and Hearing 7 Institute at Houston; and (G) The University of Texas School of Nursing at 8 9 Houston; The University of Texas Health Science Center at 10 (10) San Antonio, including: 11 (A) The University of Texas Medical School at San 12 13 Antonio; The University of Texas Dental School at San 14 (B) 15 Antonio; 16 (C) The University of Texas Graduate School of 17 Biomedical Sciences at San Antonio; (D) 18 The University of Texas School of Allied Health Sciences at San Antonio; and 19 The University of Texas School of Nursing at 20 (E) San Antonio; 21 22 (11)The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center, including: 23 24 (A) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson 25 Hospital; (B) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Tumor 26 27 Institute; and

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1 (C) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson 2 Science Park; and 3 (12) The University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas, including The University of Texas Medical 4 5 School--South Texas, if established under Subchapter N, Chapter 74. SECTION 6. No funds for a state fiscal biennium ending on or 6 7 before August 31, 2015, may be appropriated for the purposes of Subchapter N, Chapter 74, Education Code, as added by this Act. 8 9 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12

13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
