A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment and funding of a green job skills
3	training program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
6	adding Chapter 303A to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 303A. GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND AND TRAINING
8	<u>PROGRAM</u>
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 303A.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to:
11	(1) promote green industry employment opportunities,
12	including through the establishment of training programs to enhance
13	green job skills and create career opportunities that result in
14	high-wage jobs;
15	(2) foster regional collaboration for the development
16	of green industry employment opportunities;
17	(3) assist in the development of a highly skilled,
18	high-wage, and productive workforce in the green industry; and
19	(4) assist workers with obtaining education, skills
20	training, and labor market information to enhance their
21	employability, earnings, and standard of living.
22	Sec. 303A.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
23	(1) "Development fund" means the Texas green jok
24	skills development fund.

1	(2) "Green job" means a job in the field of renewable
2	energy or energy efficiency, including a job relating to:
3	(A) energy-efficient building, construction, and
4	retrofitting;
5	(B) renewable energy, including biomass,
6	hydroelectric, geothermal, and ocean energy, and wind and solar
7	<pre>power;</pre>
8	(C) research and development or manufacturing of
9	advanced battery or energy storage technologies;
10	(D) biofuels from non-feed food stocks;
11	(E) techniques to reduce, reuse, or recycle
12	waste;
13	(F) techniques to recycle products and convert
14	used materials into new products;
15	(G) energy efficiency assessments;
16	(H) manufacturing of sustainable products using
17	sustainable processes and materials; and
18	(I) water conservation and water efficiency.
19	(3) "Recycle" means the process of extracting
20	resources or value from waste by recovering or reusing the
21	material, including the collection and reuse of everyday waste
22	<pre>materials.</pre>
23	[Sections 303A.003-303A.020 reserved for expansion]
24	SUBCHAPTER B. GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND
25	Sec. 303A.021. TEXAS GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND.
26	(a) The Texas green job skills development fund is an account in
27	the general revenue fund. The account is composed of.

Τ	(1) legislative appropriations;
2	(2) gifts, grants, donations, and matching funds
3	received under Subsection (b); and
4	(3) other money required by law to be deposited in the
5	account.
6	(b) The commission may solicit and accept gifts, grants,
7	and donations of money from the federal government, local
8	governments, private corporations, or other persons to be used for
9	the purposes of this chapter.
10	(c) Income from money in the account shall be credited to
11	the account.
12	(d) Money in the development fund may be used only for the
13	purposes of this chapter.
14	[Sections 303A.022-303A.030 reserved for expansion]
15	SUBCHAPTER C. GREEN JOB SKILLS GRANT PROGRAM
16	Sec. 303A.031. ESTABLISHMENT OF GREEN JOB SKILLS GRANT
17	PROGRAM. The commission shall establish a green job skills grant
18	program, funded by the development fund under Section 303A.021,
19	through which the commission may award grants for the
20	implementation, expansion, and operation of green job skills
21	training programs.
22	Sec. 303A.032. GRANT PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
23	training program funded through a grant awarded under this
24	<pre>subchapter must:</pre>
25	(1) be hosted by a regional partnership that presents
26	a plan to implement training programs that lead trainees to
27	economic self-sufficiency and career pathways and includes at

1 least: (A) one university, college, technical school, 2 or other nonprofit workforce training provider; 3 (B) one chamber of commerce, local workforce 4 agency, local employer, or other public or private participating 5 6 entity; 7 (C) one economic development authority; and 8 (D) one community or faith-based nonprofit 9 organization that works with one or more targeted populations; (2) assist an eligible individual in obtaining 10 education, skills training, and labor market information to enhance 11 the individual's employability in green industries; and 12 13 (3) assist in the development of a highly skilled and productive workforce in green industries. 14 15 (b) A training program awarded a grant under this subchapter 16 shall target a population of eligible individuals for training that 17 includes: 18 (1) workers in high-demand green industries who are in or are preparing for high-wage occupations; 19 20 (2) workers in declining industries who may 21 retrained for high-wage occupations in a high-demand green 22 industry; 23 (3) agriculture, timber, or energy sector workers who may be retrained for high-wage occupations in a high-demand green 24 25 industry; (4) veterans or past or present members of the armed 26 27 forces of the United States, including the state military forces,

- 1 or a reserve component of the armed forces or the national guard;
- 2 <u>(5) unemployed workers;</u>
- 3 (6) low-income workers, unemployed youth and adults,
- 4 individuals who did not complete high school, or other underserved
- 5 sectors of the workforce in high poverty areas; or
- 6 (7) individuals otherwise determined by the
- 7 commission to be disadvantaged and in need of training to obtain
- 8 employment.
- 9 <u>(c) A training program may receive funding under this</u>
- 10 chapter for a period not to exceed three years.
- 11 (d) A training program may use grant funds for support
- 12 services, including basic skills, literacy, GED, English as a
- 13 second language, and job readiness training, career guidance, and
- 14 referral services.
- 15 (e) A percentage of the grant, to be determined by the
- 16 commission, must be devoted to administrative costs, costs related
- 17 to hiring instructors and purchasing equipment, and tuition
- 18 assistance.
- 19 Sec. 303A.033. APPLICATION. (a) A regional partnership,
- 20 as described by Section 303A.032, may apply for a grant under this
- 21 subchapter in the manner prescribed by the commission.
- 22 (b) The grant application must require the applicant to
- 23 provide to the commission the applicant's plan to continue to
- 24 operate the training program after the grant expires.
- Sec. 303A.034. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING
- 26 GRANTS. (a) In addition to the factors described by Sections
- 27 303A.032 and 303A.033, in determining whether to award a grant to an

- 1 applicant under this subchapter, the commission shall give
- 2 preference to a training program that:
- 3 (1) provides certification and a career advancement
- 4 mechanism to a worker who receives green job skills training under
- 5 the program; and
- 6 (2) leverages additional public and private resources
- 7 to fund the program, including cash or in-kind matches.
- 8 (b) Grants shall be awarded in a manner that ensures
- 9 geographic diversity.
- 10 Sec. 303A.035. RESERVATION FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS. Twenty
- 11 percent of the funds available for grant programs under this
- 12 chapter must be reserved for job skills training programs that
- 13 serve the unemployed and individuals whose incomes are at or below
- 14 200 percent of the federal poverty level.
- Sec. 303A.036. REPORT. (a) Not later than the 30th day
- 16 after the date funding for a grant under this chapter ends, the
- 17 grant recipient shall submit a report to the commission that
- 18 contains the following information:
- 19 <u>(1) the number of participants who entered the</u>
- 20 program;
- 21 (2) the demographics of the participants, including
- 22 race, gender, age, and significant barriers to education such as
- 23 <u>limited English proficiency</u>, a criminal record, or a physical or
- 24 mental disability;
- 25 (3) services received by participants, including
- 26 training, education, and support services;
- 27 (4) the amount of program spending per participant;

- 1 (5) program completion rates;
- 2 (6) factors determined to interfere significantly
- 3 with program participation or completion;
- 4 (7) the average wage at placement, including benefits,
- 5 and the rate of average wage increases after one year; and
- 6 (8) any post-employment support services provided.
- 7 (b) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the
- 8 commission shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant
- 9 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives that
- 10 includes a summary of all information submitted under Subsection
- 11 <u>(a)</u>.
- 12 Sec. 303A.037. STANDARDS. The commission by rule shall
- 13 adopt standards for a green job skills training program awarded a
- 14 grant under this subchapter.
- 15 SECTION 2. The Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt rules
- 16 for the program under Chapter 303A, Labor Code, as added by this
- 17 Act, not later than March 1, 2010.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act does not make an appropriation. This
- 19 Act takes effect only if a specific appropriation for the
- 20 implementation of the Act is provided in a general appropriations
- 21 act of the 81st Legislature.
- 22 SECTION 4. Except as provided by Section 3 of this Act, this
- 23 Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of
- 24 all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39,
- 25 Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the
- 26 vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect
- 27 September 1, 2009, except as provided by Section 3 of this Act.
