1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment and funding of a green job skills
3	training program that includes training for certain youths and
4	young veterans.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
7	adding Chapter 303A to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 303A. GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND AND TRAINING
9	PROGRAM
10	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
11	Sec. 303A.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to:
12	(1) promote green industry employment opportunities,
13	including through the establishment of training programs to enhance
14	green job skills and create career opportunities that result in
15	high-wage jobs;
16	(2) foster regional collaboration for the development
17	of green industry employment opportunities;
18	(3) assist in the development of a highly skilled,
19	high-wage, and productive workforce in the green industry; and
20	(4) assist workers, including youth and young
21	veterans, with obtaining education, skills training, and labor
22	market information to enhance their employability, earnings, and
23	standard of living.
24	Sec. 303A.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

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1	(1) "Development fund" means the Texas green job
2	skills development fund.
3	(2) "Green job" means a job in the field of renewable
4	energy or energy efficiency, including a job relating to:
5	(A) energy-efficient building, construction, and
6	<pre>retrofitting;</pre>
7	(B) renewable energy, including biomass,
8	hydroelectric, geothermal, and ocean energy, and wind and solar
9	power;
10	(C) research and development or manufacturing of
11	advanced battery or energy storage technologies;
12	(D) biofuels from non-feed food stocks;
13	(E) techniques to reduce, reuse, or recycle
14	waste;
15	(F) techniques to recycle products and convert
16	used materials into new products;
17	(G) energy efficiency assessments;
18	(H) manufacturing of sustainable products using
19	sustainable processes and materials; and
20	(I) water conservation and water efficiency.
21	(3) "Recycle" means the process of extracting
22	resources or value from waste by recovering or reusing the
23	material, including the collection and reuse of everyday waste
24	materials.

26	SUBCHAPTER B. GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND
27	Sec. 303A.021. TEXAS GREEN JOB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND.

C.S.S.B. No. 108 1 (a) The Texas green job skills development fund is an account in 2 the general revenue fund. The account is composed of: 3 (1) legislative appropriations; 4 (2) gifts, grants, donations, and matching funds 5 received under Subsection (b); and 6 (3) other money required by law to be deposited in the 7 account. 8 (b) The commission may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations of money from the federal government, local governments, 9 10 private corporations, or other persons to be used for the purposes of this chapter. 11 12 (c) Income from money in the account shall be credited to 13 the account. 14 (d) Money in the development fund may be used only for the 15 purposes of this chapter. 16 [Sections 303A.022-303A.030 reserved for expansion] 17 SUBCHAPTER C. GREEN JOB SKILLS GRANT PROGRAM Sec. 303A.031. ESTABLISHMENT OF GREEN JOB SKILLS GRANT 18 19 PROGRAMS. (a) The commission shall establish a green job skills grant program, funded by the development fund under Section 20 303A.021, through which the commission may award grants for the 21 implementation, expansion, and operation of green job skills 22 23 training programs. 24 (b) As part of the green jobs skills grant program, the commission shall develop a youth training program that promotes the 25 26 economic self-sufficiency of youth and young veterans by providing

those persons with opportunities to acquire green job skills while

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1	performing community service activities.
2	Sec. 303A.032. PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be
3	eligible to participate in the youth training program developed
4	under Section 303A.031(b), a participant must be an individual who
5	is at least 16 years of age but not older than 24 years of age on the
6	date of enrollment in a project and who:
7	(1) is not attending high school and has not received a
8	high school diploma or high school equivalency certificate; or
9	(2) is:
10	(A) attending high school or a program leading to
11	<u>a high school equivalency certificate but is at risk of dropping out</u>
12	of high school or the equivalency certification program; and
13	(B) recommended for enrollment in the project by
14	the high school or the equivalency certification program.
15	(b) In addition to meeting the requirements of Subsection
16	(a), a program participant must be:
17	(1) an individual who is:
18	(A) a member of a household that receives public
19	assistance and earns not more than 80 percent of the area median
20	income;
21	(B) educationally disadvantaged, as defined by
22	commission rule; or
23	(C) referred to the program by a school district,
24	state agency, or court; or
25	(2) a veteran who is not older than 24 years of age on
26	initial participation in the program.
27	Sec. 303A.033. GRANT PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. (a) A training

No. 108 program described by Section 303A.031 funded through a grant 1 2 awarded under this subchapter must: 3 (1) be hosted by a regional partnership that presents a plan to implement training programs that lead trainees to 4 5 economic self-sufficiency and career pathways and includes at 6 least: 7 (A) one university, college, technical school, 8 or other nonprofit workforce training provider; 9 (B) one chamber of commerce, local workforce 10 agency, local employer, or other public or private participating 11 entity; 12 (C) one economic development authority; and (D) one community or faith-based nonprofit 13 14 organization that works with one or more targeted populations; 15 (2) assist an eligible individual in obtaining education, skills training, and labor market information to enhance 16 17 the individual's employability in green industries; and (3) assist in the development of a highly skilled and 18 19 productive workforce in green industries. (b) Except as provided by Section 303A.032, a training 20 program awarded a grant under this subchapter shall target a 21 population of eligible individuals for training that includes: 22 (1) workers in high-demand green industries who are in 23 24 or are preparing for high-wage occupations; 25 (2) workers in declining industries who may be 26 retrained for high-wage occupations in a high-demand green 27 industry;

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1	(3) agriculture, timber, or energy sector workers who
2	may be retrained for high-wage occupations in a high-demand green
3	industry;
4	(4) veterans or past or present members of the armed
5	forces of the United States, including the state military forces,
6	or a reserve component of the armed forces or the national guard;
7	(5) unemployed workers;
8	(6) low-income workers, unemployed youth and adults,
9	individuals who did not complete high school, or other underserved
10	sectors of the workforce in high poverty areas; or
11	(7) individuals otherwise determined by the
12	commission to be disadvantaged and in need of training to obtain
13	employment.
14	(c) A training program may receive funding under this
15	chapter for a period not to exceed three years.
16	(d) A training program may use grant funds for support
17	services, including basic skills, literacy, GED, English as a
18	second language, and job readiness training, career guidance, and
19	referral services.
20	(e) A percentage of the grant, to be determined by the
21	commission, must be devoted to administrative costs, costs related
22	to hiring instructors and purchasing equipment, and tuition
23	assistance.
24	Sec. 303A.034. APPLICATION. (a) A regional partnership,
25	as described by Section 303A.033, may apply for a grant under this
26	subchapter in the manner prescribed by the commission.
27	(b) The grant application must require the applicant to

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1	provide to the commission the applicant's plan to continue to
2	operate the training program after the grant expires.
3	Sec. 303A.035. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING
4	GRANTS. (a) In addition to the factors described by Sections
5	303A.033 and 303A.034, in determining whether to award a grant to an
6	applicant under this subchapter, the commission shall give
7	preference to a training program that:
8	(1) provides certification and a career advancement
9	mechanism to a worker who receives green job skills training under
10	the program; and
11	(2) leverages additional public and private resources
12	to fund the program, including cash or in-kind matches.
13	(b) Grants shall be awarded in a manner that ensures
14	geographic diversity.
15	Sec. 303A.036. RESERVATION FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS. Twenty
16	percent of the funds available for grant programs under this
17	chapter must be reserved for job skills training programs that
18	serve the unemployed and individuals whose incomes are at or below
19	200 percent of the federal poverty level.
20	Sec. 303A.037. PROJECT REQUIREMENTS; SERVICES TO
21	PARTICIPANTS. A project for which a grant is received under the
22	youth training program must provide to a participant integrated
23	green job occupational skills training and education, divided
24	between:
25	(A) practical, hands-on work experience at
26	project sites; and
27	(B) if the participant has not received a high

No. 108 1 school diploma or high school equivalency certificate, academic and project-based instruction designed to result in the attainment of a 2 high school diploma or high school equivalency certificate, of 3 which at least 50 percent of the instruction is devoted to applied 4 5 academic instruction. 6 Sec. 303A.038. TRAINING STIPEND. (a) To the extent 7 authorized by federal law and regulations, a project for which a 8 grant is received under the youth training program must provide a training stipend to each participant enrolled in the project. A 9 training stipend under this section must be: 10 11 (1) in an amount determined by commission rule; 12 (2) provided for a period not to exceed two years; and (3) conditioned on the demonstration by the 13 participant of improved job performance and personal 14 15 responsibility as determined by commission rule. 16 (b) To the extent authorized by federal law and regulations, 17 a stipend provided under this section does not count as income or resources for purposes of determining the eligibility of the 18 19 participant or the participant's household for any form of public assistance or in determining the amount of that assistance. 20 21 (c) A stipend provided under this section may include a plan for incentives under which additional compensation is provided to a 22 participant who demonstrates excellent attendance and performance. 23 Sec. 303A.039. REPORTS. (a) Not later than the 30th day 24 after the date funding for a grant under this chapter ends, the 25 26 grant recipient shall submit a report to the commission that contains the following information: 27

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1	(1) the number of participants who entered the
2	program;
3	(2) the demographics of the participants, including
4	race, gender, age, and significant barriers to education such as
5	limited English proficiency, a criminal record, or a physical or
6	<pre>mental disability;</pre>
7	(3) services received by participants, including
8	training, education, and support services;
9	(4) the amount of program spending per participant;
10	(5) program completion rates;
11	(6) factors determined to interfere significantly
12	with program participation or completion;
13	(7) the average wage at placement, including benefits,
14	and the rate of average wage increases after one year; and
15	(8) any post-employment support services provided.
16	(b) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the
17	commission shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant
18	governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives that
19	includes a summary of all information submitted under Subsection
20	<u>(a).</u>
21	(c) In the report submitted under Subsection (b), the
22	commission shall include the following information for grants
23	awarded under the youth training program:
24	(1) the number of grants awarded;
25	(2) the total dollar amount of grants awarded;
26	(3) the geographical distribution of grants awarded;
27	(4) the number of youths and other participants

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1	enrolled in projects funded by grants;
2	(5) the number of youths and other participants who
3	are projected to secure full-time jobs at the conclusion of
4	participation in projects funded by grants;
5	(6) the number of youths who are projected to graduate
6	from high school or receive a high school equivalency certificate
7	while participating in the program; and
8	(7) the estimated dollar savings due to improved
9	energy efficiency in projects funded by grants.
10	Sec. 303A.040. STANDARDS. The commission by rule shall
11	adopt standards for the green job skills training program and youth
12	training program established under this subchapter.
13	SECTION 2. The Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt rules
14	for the program under Chapter 303A, Labor Code, as added by this
15	Act, not later than March 1, 2010.
16	SECTION 3. (a) Subchapter B, Chapter 303A, Labor Code, as
17	added by this Act, takes effect September 1, 2009.
18	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (a) of this section,
19	the Texas Workforce Commission is required to implement the green
20	job skills grant program under Chapter 303A, Labor Code, as added by
21	this Act, only if:
22	(1) the legislature appropriates money for that
23	purpose; or
24	(2) funds are received from the federal government for
25	the implementation of the program.
26	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
