A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the creation and publication of cancer incidence maps 3 by the Department of State Health Services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 82, Health and Safety Code, is amended by 6 adding Section 82.0051 to read as follows:
- Sec. 82.0051. CANCER INCIDENCE MAPS. (a) The department

 shall collect and develop statistical data on the incidence of

 particular types of cancer in the state and shall plot this data on
- 11 <u>(b) The department shall establish and maintain a</u>
 12 computerized mapping system for plotting the incidence of each type

computer-generated cancer incidence maps.

- 13 of cancer reported. In plotting incidences of cancer, the
- 14 <u>department shall employ a spatial filter or other statistical</u>
- 15 method to detect statistical anomalies and identify cancer
- 16 <u>clusters.</u> The department shall plot incidences of cancer by census
- 17 block, as recognized by the United States Census Bureau, except
- 18 that if the board determines that plotting by this method could make
- 19 <u>it possible to identify a particular individual with cancer, the</u>
- 20 department shall aggregate census blocks to protect the
- 21 <u>individual's identity.</u>

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- 22 (c) The department shall:
- 23 (1) post the cancer incidence maps on its Internet 24 website and make the maps available to the public by other means the

- 1 department considers appropriate; and
- 2 (2) annually update the maps.
- 3 (d) The department shall submit a quarterly report to the
- 4 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 5 representatives that includes:
- 6 (1) the current status of data entry into the mapping
- 7 system required under Subsection (b);
- 8 (2) information remaining to be gathered or entered
- 9 into the mapping system; and
- 10 (3) progress in using the mapping system to identify
- 11 <u>cancer clusters.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 82.007(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The department shall publish an annual report to the
- 15 legislature of the information obtained or created under this
- 16 chapter.
- 17 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than the 180th day after the
- 18 effective date of this Act, the department shall submit an initial
- 19 report to the legislature. The department shall make a draft of the
- 20 report available to the public for review and comment not later than
- 21 the 30th day before the day the report is submitted to the
- 22 legislature. The report must include:
- 23 (1) the scientific strengths and limitations of
- 24 statistical cancer incidence mapping as related to cancer
- 25 recognition, prevention, cure, or control;
- 26 (2) the appropriate use and publication of cancer
- 27 incidence maps; and

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- 1 (3) the implementation of safeguards to prevent misuse
- 2 of cancer incidence mapping, including:
- 3 (A) collecting background data that ensures the
- 4 accuracy of reported cancer diagnoses;
- 5 (B) identifying the appropriate uses of the
- 6 mapping; and
- 7 (C) ensuring the confidentiality of all
- 8 individual medical data.
- 9 (b) Not later than the 90th day after the date the initial
- 10 report is submitted under Subsection (a) of this section, the
- 11 department shall post on its Internet website maps that show the
- 12 incidences of:
- 13 (1) lung cancer; and
- 14 (2) breast cancer.
- 15 (c) Not later than the 180th day after the date the maps are
- 16 posted under Subsection (b) of this section, the department shall
- 17 post on its Internet website maps that show the incidences of:
- 18 (1) colorectal cancer;
- 19 (2) prostate cancer; and
- 20 (3) all types of cancer in the aggregate.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
