A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the portion of designated tuition required to be set
- 3 aside to provide student financial assistance at institutions of
- 4 higher education.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 56.011(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 9 education shall cause to be set aside not less than 20 percent of
- 10 any amount of tuition charged to a resident undergraduate student
- 11 under Section 54.0513 in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour.
- 12 The funds set aside under this section by an institution shall be
- 13 used to provide need-based financial assistance for resident
- 14 undergraduate students enrolled in the institution.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 56.012(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 18 education shall cause to be set aside not less than 15 percent of
- 19 any amount of tuition charged to a resident student enrolled in a
- 20 graduate or professional degree program under Section 54.0513 in
- 21 excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. The funds set aside under
- this section by an institution shall be used to provide need-based
- 23 financial assistance for resident students enrolled in graduate and
- 24 professional degree programs at the institution.

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 56.465(a), Education Code, is amended to 2 read as follows:
- a) The governing board of each institution of higher education shall cause to be set aside five percent of the amount of the tuition charged to a resident undergraduate student at the institution under Section 54.0513 in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. The amount of a student's tuition set aside under this subsection is <u>in addition to</u> [considered a part of] the amount required to be set aside from that tuition under Section 56.011.
- SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Sections 56.011 and 56.012, Education Code, applies only to financial aid awarded for a semester or term that begins on or after the effective date of this Act, and does not affect a student's right to receive financial aid awarded before the effective date of this Act for any part of the 2009-2010 academic year.
- 16 (b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 56.465,
 17 Education Code, applies beginning with tuition paid for the
 18 2009-2010 academic year. The change in law does not affect the
 19 amount of tuition set aside under that section for an academic
 20 period before the 2009-2010 academic year, and the former law is
 21 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
