- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 51.4034 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 51.4034. ANNUAL REPORT ON FACTORS CONSIDERED IN
- 9 ADMISSIONS DECISIONS. (a) Not later than July 1 of each year, each
- 10 public or private institution of higher education in this state
- 11 shall provide to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and
- to the chair of each legislative standing committee or subcommittee
- 13 with primary jurisdiction over higher education, and shall make
- 14 available to the public on the institution's website, a report
- 15 regarding whether, in admitting applicants to any undergraduate,
- 16 graduate, postgraduate, or professional degree program, the
- 17 <u>institution</u> or any school or department of the institution
- 18 <u>considers:</u>
- (1) an applicant's race, color, ethnicity, or national
- 20 <u>origin; or</u>
- 21 (2) whether a family member of the applicant has
- 22 previously attended the institution, is a donor to the institution,
- or is otherwise associated with the institution.
- 24 (b) If the public or private institution of higher education

- or a school or department of the institution considers race, color,
- 2 ethnicity, or national origin in making admissions decisions as
- 3 described by Subsection (a)(1), the report must contain the
- 4 following information with respect to the institution, school, or
- 5 department, as applicable:
- 6 (1) for any group identified by race, color,
- 7 ethnicity, or national origin that is considered in admissions
- 8 <u>decisions</u>, how membership in that group is determined for
- 9 individual applicants;
- 10 (2) how membership in that group is considered in
- 11 <u>admissions decisions</u>, including:
- 12 (A) the weight given to consideration of
- membership in that group; and
- 14 (B) the use of any targets, quotas, or other
- numbers-based goals for that group;
- 16 (3) why membership in that group is considered in
- 17 admissions decisions, including:
- 18 (A) the degree to which members of that group are
- 19 represented at the institution, school, or department; and
- 20 (B) any correlation between the admission of
- 21 those group members and the educational goals of the institution,
- 22 school, or department, including any goal to increase diversity in
- 23 the student population;
- 24 (4) if membership in that group is considered in
- 25 admissions decisions because of an educational goal of the
- 26 <u>institution</u>, school, or department, what consideration has been
- 27 given to any available alternatives, including alternatives that

- 1 are neutral with respect to race, color, ethnicity, or national
- 2 origin, for achieving that goal;
- 3 (5) how frequently and in what manner the institution,
- 4 school, or department reassesses the need to consider membership in
- 5 that group in admissions decisions;
- 6 (6) an analysis of the correlation between membership
- 7 <u>in any group given preference in admissions decisions on account of</u>
- 8 race, color, ethnicity, or national origin and:
- 9 (A) the enrollment rates of members of that group
- in remedial or developmental programs relative to members of other
- 11 groups;
- 12 (B) the graduation rates of members of that group
- 13 relative to members of other groups; and
- 14 (C) the rate of default by members of that group
- on education loans relative to members of other groups; and
- 16 (7) any factors other than race, color, ethnicity, or
- 17 national origin for which information is collected for use in the
- 18 admissions decisions covered by the report.
- 19 (c) To enable a statistical comparison of the weight given
- 20 to race, color, ethnicity, or national origin relative to the
- 21 <u>factors described by Subsection (b)(7)</u>, if the factors disclosed
- 22 under that subdivision include high school grades, grade point
- 23 averages, or class rank, scores on standardized tests, including
- 24 the ACT or SAT, legacy status, gender, state residency, or other
- 25 quantifiable criteria, the public or private institution of higher
- 26 education must provide the following information with the report in
- 27 a standard computer-readable format:

- 1 (1) all quantifiable or other computer-readable raw
- 2 admissions data linked to specific applicants, including the
- 3 applicants' race, color, ethnicity, or national origin, as
- 4 <u>applicable; and</u>
- 5 (2) the admissions decisions made by the institution,
- 6 school, or department regarding those applicants.
- 7 (d) The information required by Subsection (c) may not
- 8 identify the applicants by name or in another manner that would
- 9 enable a person to identify an individual applicant using the data.
- 10 (e) If the public or private institution of higher education
- or a school or department of the institution considers a factor
- described by Subsection (a)(2) in making admissions decisions, the
- 13 report must contain the following information with respect to the
- institution, school, or department, as applicable:
- 15 <u>(1)</u> how the relevant information is determined for
- 16 <u>individual applicants;</u>
- 17 (2) how the factor is considered in admissions
- 18 decisions, including the weight given to consideration of the
- 19 factor;
- 20 (3) why the factor is considered in admissions
- 21 decisions, including the degree to which applicants identified as
- 22 sharing that factor are represented at the institution, school, or
- 23 department; and
- 24 (4) how frequently and in what manner the institution,
- 25 school, or department reassesses the need to consider the factor in
- 26 admissions decisions.
- 27 (f) Students of a private or independent institution of

- 1 higher education that does not substantially comply with this
- 2 section as determined by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 3 Board are ineligible for tuition equalization grants under
- 4 Subchapter F, Chapter 61.
- 5 SECTION 2. Each public or private institution of higher
- 6 education in this state shall submit the first report required by
- 7 Section 51.4034, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later
- 8 than July 1, 2010.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
