| 20 | with each institution of higher education to which this chapter |
| 21 | applies, shall develop and maintain online resumes for each of |
| 22 | those institutions. |
| 23 | (b) The coordinating board shall: |

- 15 page;
- 16 (B) uses enhanced, user-friendly search
- 17 capabilities to ensure that the information required to be included
- 18 in the resume is easily accessible to the persons for whom the
- 19 resume is designed; and
- 20 (C) includes a clearly identifiable link to
- 21 information on the coordinating board's Internet website regarding
- 22 the coordinating board's higher education accountability system;
- 23 and
- 24 (4) ensure that the information provided in each
- 25 resume is accurate and up to date and includes the most recent data
- 26 available for out-of-state peer institutions.
- 27 (c) The coordinating board may modify, as the coordinating

- 2 institution's out-of-state peer institutions to ensure uniformity
- 3 in the comparison of that data to data regarding the institution for

- 7 resume any category of information that is unavailable to the
- 8 <u>coordinating board.</u>
